day of July 1796. This Will was proved
by the Oaths of Philip Lumsden John Bar and
James M. Brown, who were sworn, and ordered to be
Recorded. And on the Motion of Aquila Logan,
William Hamilton and Hugh Logan, the Executors
and Exors therein named who made Oath and Exco-
cuted acknowledged. Bona as the law directs, a writ of
certiorari is granted them for obtaining a Probate thereof
in due form

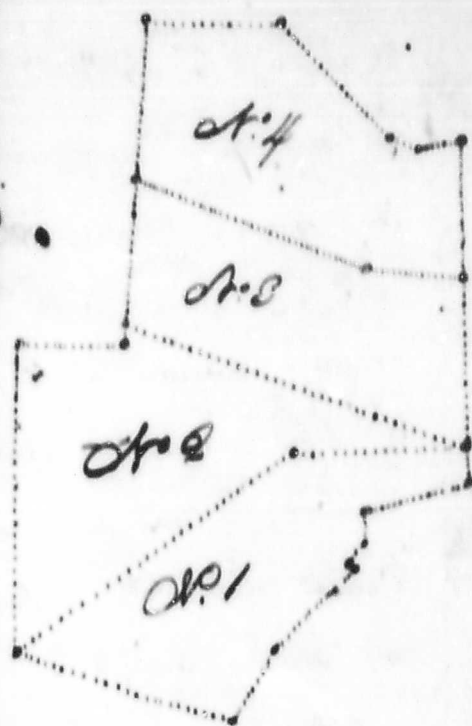
