I Will and give and devise the plantation I bought
of John Jones lying on Dicks River in Lincoln County State
of Kentucky, and all the Stock and plantation tools that
may be on the Plantation at my Decease unto my son in Law
Henry Pauling and Elizabeth Pauling my daughter to them &
their heirs for ever.

I Will and Give and Devise all the other Lands in
and to which I have legal and Just Claims Title or Interest
to my son Gabb Waller and his heirs forever. I also give to
my son Gabb Waller my Negro Tom or his heir forever. Also
I Give that after my Decease that my son Gabb Waller have
and support my Negro Sambo.

I Will after all my Just Debts and funeral expenses
are paid that all the residue of my Estate of what kind &
description soever may be equally divided to my son Gabb
Waller and my son in Law Henry Pauling and Elizabeth
Pauling his Wife to them & their heirs forever.

And I hereby Constitute and appoint my son

Cabel Wallis and my son in Law Henry Pawling and
Elizabeth Pawling his wife, Executors of this my last
Will & Testament hereby making and disannulling all
former Wills by me made Declaring and publishing this
Writing to be my only true last Will & Testament. In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 24th
April One Thousand seven hundred & Ninety four.
