as much in property as I have generally given to those of my children already named but it shall be left to her own judgment how much and in what kind of property to give to make them equal and further it is my will that as soon as my many and outstanding debts can be collected that my executors and my executor to purchase a negro or negroes with the same and that said purchase shall also remain in my wife's hands until her death and at her decease the said purchase together with all the rest of estate be equally divided on all my children but further if my should ^{chance to} hereafter marry in that case I will and bequeath to her only one full third of all my estate both real and personal during her life and at her death to descend as above directed and the balance of estate at the time of her marriage to go to the use of my children and I do nominate and appoint my wife and my son John Yantes my executors and executors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day of November 1804 signed and acknowledged in presence of us
