2^{ndly} I give to James W. Farn all money or
debts which is or may hereafter be due me either for
Interest or otherwise for services rendered the United States
in the late Contest with Great Britain as a Dragoon
in Captain Amongs Company

3^{rdly} I appoint James W. Farn sole Executor of
this my last Will and Testament. And I do hereby
revoke and make void all other Gifts Grants or legacies
which doth in any wise interfere with this testifying and
confirming this to be my last Will and Testament. In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this 16th day of October Anno Domini 1795.

A County Court held for Lincoln County the 15th day of December 1795. This Instrument of Writing was Exhibited in Court as the last Will & Testament of William Ramsey Deceased, and was proved to be his act and Sent by the Oaths of Edward Young and Thomas Montgomery Witnesses thereof, and ordered to be recorded. And on the petition of James old Town the Executor therein named, who made Oath, and with David Elrod & John old Town his Sureties entered into and acknowledged Bond in the penalty of Two hundred Pounds (conditioned as the law directs) a Certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due Form.

November the 30th 1795 agreeable to an Order of Court to us directed to appraise the Estate of John Vaughan Deceased after being first sworn according to Law have proceeded as followeth the wit
