And Lastly I appointed my Father in law Mr. William Buford my sole Executor of this my last will & Testament he being of the State of Kentucky Lincoln County.

The following Persons were called upon by the Testator in his last sickness to take notice of the above Testamentary words which was committed to writing the 23rd day of October 1794. Viz. Blanks Moody, William Easty, Settlement Wells.

In the presence of the Court now sitting I William Todd presiding Magistrate of the said Court do hereby certify that William Tunstall who hath attested the above copy is Clerk of the County Court aforesaid and that the said attestation is in due form and that all due faith and credit ought to be had and given to the said attestation. Given under my hand and the seal of the County aforesaid the date above agreeable to an act of Congress passed in their second session entitled an act to prescribe the mode in which the public acts, records and judicial proceedings in each State shall be authenticated so as to take effect in every other State.
