being in good Health and sound memory Thanks be unto God for the same
and calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that
it is appointed for all men once to Die do make & Declare this my
last will and testament that a lawful princeps and just of all
I give & give unto my soul into the hands of God that gave it
and for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a
Christian like & decent manner at the discretion of my Executors
in kind according but at the general direction I have received
the same again by the might Power of God and a Touching such
Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bestow to me in this
life I give devise and dispose of the same in the manner of my following
that is to say
In the first place I do bequeath my Land & my estate and
lawful Debt to be paid out of my moveable Estate In the next place
I give and I do bequeath to my dear wife beloved wife and my
moveable Estate that I do have and likewise to be divided in my
land during her life and at her death I do give my lands to be
and equally divided among my three children Elizabeth
I am Elizabeth Hanna's daughter I do bequeath to her
an equal share likewise I do allow my Brother John Hanna
one fellow laborer to keep his pocket I have I do bequeath to
my three slaves viz. Jables Hanna to be divided among my
three children of this my last will and testament I do bequeath
all my moveable Estate debts and accounts and every thing I have
following, with all goods bequeath and bequeath by me in any way
for this time named willed and bequeath and confirmed this
and no other to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have
for my hand & foot the day & year above written

At a Court held in Lincoln County the 23rd day of September 1790

This will was proved by the Oath of James Davis
Galbraith and Robert Viner Witnesses thereto and was read & recorded
and on the motion of Jables Hanna and Jacob Mable the Executors
and Executors therein named who made oath and admitted and acknowledged
said bond as his own debt. Teste as aforesaid them for Alexander
Hanna

and goodness of God the best weak in body yet of a sound and
perfect mind and calling to mind the Mortality of my
body do constitute this my last will and Testament and do
renew it to be received as such by all. I have I most humbly
begotten my soul to God who gave it begging his most gracious
acceptance of it which I trust he will do when I come to him
for Mercy. And after the burial of my body in a Christianlike
manner I have to dispose of such worldly Estate as it hath
been pleased God to bestow me with in the following manner.
I have after the payment of all my just Debts I give and be-
queath unto my dear beloved Wife Elizabeth Bowdery all my
Estate Real and personal after my decease to do with as she
shall please during her natural life and after her death to
be equally divided between my two youngest daughters Emily
Mabel Bowdery and Martha Bowdery to them and their
Heirs forever. I have I appoint as my Executors my Son James
Bowdery, and my wife beloved wife Elizabeth Bowdery.
