tament in manner and form following to wit.

Imprimis I give and bequeath to my dear wife Anne Shells the
following Slaves, namely Tom and Bess, with all her Bess's fu-
ture increase to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my friend John Hunter for hundred
dolls of land part of a Tract of land located by William McConnell
for Benjamin Netherlands, by the said Nathaniel conveyed to me
and conveyed for me by the said McConnell a part of a Tract of land
her heirs

purchased by me of John Martin for which I have the said Martin Bond for conveyance. The first mentioned tract containing fifteen thousand acres or thereabouts, and lying near the big bone in Hayette County, and the last that purchased of Martin, containing thirty seven thousand acres or thereabouts, the said Quantity of five hundred acres of land to be laid off in one body, and of a convenient form in either of the tracts above mentioned for the said John Hunter at his option.

I Give and bequeath the same to him the said John Hunter and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my dear wife Anne I shall see my household furniture of every kind, and all my stocks of Horses, cattle, Hogs and Sheep to her and her Heirs forever.

Item it is my will and desire that my Executor herein after to be named, shall sell my Mills and brewing utensils and as much of my lands, as besides the Mills and brewing utensils may be necessary for that purpose for the payment of my just debts, and thereby direct and empower her to sell such and so much of my said Lands as she may find to be necessary for that purpose.

Item, I give and bequeath all the rest and remainder of my lands not herein before bequeathed or disposed of to my dear wife Anne and to my daughter who was born in the 10th of this month of August, when not yet Christened but is to be named Catharine Harris, to be equally divided between my said Wife and Child, each persons part, to her and her heirs forever. But it is my Will and Desire, that if it should be

found by my said Wife to be more for her interest and that of my Daughter, to sell and dispose of all my lands so given and devised by the my last Will to her and my said Daughter equally to be divided ^{between} them that she my said Wife shall have power to sell and dispose of the same for the best price that can be got for the same, and she is hereby empowered to sell and dispose of the same to any person whatever and to convey the same in fee simple to any purchaser or purchasers of the same. And the money arising from such sale I give and devise to my said dear wife Anne and my said Daughter who is to be named Catharine Harris to be equally divided between them.

And whereas my dear wife has become entitled by the death of her deceased father John Harris Esq. of Bucks County in the State of Pennsylvania to a part of his estate both real and personal. I do hereby give and bequeath, all my right and title claim interest and ~~devise~~ ^{reversion} Estate in and to all and every part of the same to my dear Wife Anne I shall to her and her Heirs forever.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint my said Wife Anne I shall to be my sole Executor of this my last will and Testament. And it is my will and desire that if my said daughter to be named Catharine Harris should die before she attains the age of eighteen years or marries that all the Estate in lands or otherwise herein before given to my said daughter, shall goe to my said Wife and in such case I give and bequeath the same to my said Wife and her Heirs forever.
