I John Cartwright of Lincoln County being in a low state of
health, let of a Sound and sound mind and memory, and calling to mind
the uncertainty of this transitory life, and knowing that it is appointed
by God for me when I shall die, I do hereby make and establish this
to be my last will and Testament, first I recommend my soul to
Almighty God, the giver of all things, and my body to the earth,
from whence it came, to be decently buried by my Executors herein
after to be named, and with respect to my worldly Estate which I
have placed Almighty God to entrust, I do hereby give of disposing
in manner and form following, viz—
That I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth

Carpenter all that Tract or Parcel of Land containing by
survey four hundred Acres laying on the head of the West fork
of Carpenter Creek adjoining the Land of Thomas Montgomery
& John Fry on the banks of Green River which I purchased
of Isaac Cistern. I also give and bequeath to my son
George Carpenter five hundred Acres of Land, five hundred
Acres of which shall be my Settlers and Tracts whereon I
now live as the same was surveyed & the other one hundred
Acres to be taken of my Preemption Right. Beginning at the
South west corner of the aforesaid Settlement of four hundred
Acres & running from thence South so far as that a line line
extended East as far as to the South East corner of the aforesaid
Settlement Tract will include one hundred Acres -
I also give and bequeath to my Daughter Margaret Carpenter,
four hundred and thirty five Acres being a Part of my
Preemption, laying South and South Eastwardly of my
Settlement, and adjoining the Land of William
Monger. Beginning at a large Beech Tree on the East of the
Calden Branch of Carpenter Creek, being the most
South Eastwardly corner of my Preemption & running
thence North Two hundred and ten Poles, then West to the
South East corner of my Settlement Tract of four hundred
Acres, thence South and West bounding on the lines that
shall include the one hundred Acres of my Preemption
already bequeathed to my son George Carpenter, & then
South along the line of the Two hundred Acres Tract to
William Carpenter & so on with the line of my Preemption
as the same was surveyed, to the aforesaid Beech Tree -
Beginning - I also give and bequeath to my Daughter
Margaret Carpenter my Share or one half of the three
hundred Acres of Land located on the Shaw in the

County of Williams. I also give and bequeath to my Daughter
Mary Carpenter Two hundred and eighty five Acres of Land being
that Part of my Preemption that lays East of my Settlement
Tract of four hundred Acres. Beginning at the North East Corner
of the aforesaid Settlement Tract running thence East along a line of
my Preemption One hundred and thirty poles, thence South along
an other line of my Preemption Two hundred and fifty poles, thence
West to the South East corner of the aforesaid Settlement Tract and North
along a line of the same to the Beginning - I also give and bequeath
to my Daughter Mary Carpenter that Tract or parcel of Land con-
taining Two hundred Acres more or less, which I purchased of John
Bentley being a part of the said John Bentleys Preemption, as
described in a bond of conveyance from the said Bentley to myself &
I also give and bequeath to my son George Carpenter Two hundred
Acres of Land near the head of the North fork of the Rowling fork
of Salt River entered in my own name at the place called the Oak
Garden which is surveyed, I also give and bequeath to my son George
Carpenter, an Entry of one hundred Acres which I have adjoining
to the aforesaid Two hundred Acres on the head of the North fork of
the Rowling fork on the North and North East thereof. It is
further my will and desire that all my other Lands or parts of
Land which are not heretofore particularly mentioned and
ordered of should be sold by my Executors hereinafter named
and the Money arising thereupon to be equally divided between
my Wife Elizabeth Carpenter, and my three Children viz
Daughter Margaret Carpenter & my son George Carpenter,
except so much thereof as my said Executors shall think requi-
site & necessary for the Education of my said three Children -
I also give and bequeath to my son George Carpenter my two
Negroes boys vizt, Joe & Adam but I lend the said two
Negroes to my Wife Elizabeth Carpenter during her life

Widowhood or until my son George Carpenter shall come
at the Age of Twenty one Years. I also here unto my wife
Elizabeth Carpenter the Plantation whereon I now live
during her Widowhood or until my son George Carpenter
shall come at the Age of Twenty one Years. I give and
bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Carpenter all my Linnen
& there furniture, & such of my Bills and debts as she may
come to keep, also a Blow with Irons & Glass for two hours
also my large Bald Eagle staff, also my four milk cows,
also six Head of sheep also two Great Breasting swine, also
all my powder. I do my farther will and desire that all
the Rest of my Personal Estate not herein before
disposed of shall be sold by my Executors, and the
Monies arising therefrom to be equally divided between
my wife Elizabeth Carpenter and my three Children
vizt, my two daughters Margaret & Mary Carpenter
and my son George Carpenter. I give and bequeath
to my Brother George Carpenter the sum of Ten
Pounds to be paid by my Executors for the purposes of
Educating & Schooling his Children - I also give and
bequeath to my Brother Adam Carpenter an Entry or
Location which I have of One hundred Acres adjoining
To the Tract of two hundred Acres which I formerly
sold to him - It is my farther will and desire that in case
either of my three Children herein before named should
die without Issue that in case his or their Estate should be
equally divided between the surviving Ones -
I also give and bequeath to Adam Carpenter Two
hundred Acres of Land to be laid off at the West end
of my Preemption, vizt, Beginning at the South West
corner of my Settlement Tract of four hundred Acres

thence South Sixty five Degrees West with the line of my Preemption
Tract and also Twenty poles thence South to the corner and forty
Poles with another line of my Preemption thence East so far as
that a line extended North to the 1st Settlement Tract & thence
West to the Beginning will enclose the Quantity of Two hundred Acres
which is to be commenced at the Line formerly sold to him. I do hereby
appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Carpenter, George
Carpenter, and Adam Carpenter to be my Executors of this my Last
Will & Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal this 17th day of November 1784
