In the Name of God amen. I John Berry of Lincoln County
and State of Virginia being of sound and disposing mind and memory
do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner
and form following that is to say first I will that all my Debt and
funeral charges be paid by my Executors hereinafter named also -
I give and devise unto my two sons James and William their heirs
I give unto them that tract of land containing three hundred acres -
lying on the water of Lichon Creek which I bought of William

McNair to be equally Divided between my two sons above mentioned
and as to my movable Estate I will and declare that it be equally
Divided between my Daughters Polly, Polly, Sally, Hannah, Peggy &
Jane and their portions to be Delivered to them at the time they shall arrive
to years of their lawful age also I give and devise unto my two sons Joseph
and John also that tract of land my family now live on in Lincoln County
and State of Virginia and their heirs and assigns forever, but not meaning
or intending that they or either of them shall have any Demands on the last
mentioned lands unless the Death or marriage of Hannah my wife be inter-
vened and now that she my said wife have the whole and sole use and benefit of
the plantation aforesaid during the time of her natural age or so long as she
survives my widow and her heirs and assigns forever hereinafter my
wife to execute to them my last will and testament and lastly for my said
two daughters Polly and Sally I have set my hand and seal this 20th day of August -
1789
