At a Court Held for Lincoln County the 19th day of January 1790
The Inventory and Appraisment was returned and Read to
be Received

In the name of God Amen I Robert a Montgomerie
Senior of the County of Lincoln and State of Virginia being
through the mercies of God though weak in body yet of sound
and perfect understanding and memory do hereby certify that
to be my last will and Testament, and desire it to be received
by me as such in the first place most humbly beseeching my
Sovereign to God my maker beseeching his most gracious acceptance
of it through the ever sufficient and glorious mediation and merits
of my most compassionate Redeemer Jesus Christ who graciously
to be an Attainment for my sin and is able to save to the uttermost
all that come unto God by him seeing he even liveth to make
intercession for them and who I trust will not reject me as being
my penitent sinner when I come to him for mercy in this step
and confidence. I render up my soul with comfort humbly beseeching
Blessed glorious Heavenly our God most Holy most merciful and
gracious to prepare me for the time of Dissolution and then to

Stakeholder to himself into that Peace and rest and accomplishment
fully which he has prepared for those that love and fear his holy
name Amen Signed Witness

I promise I give my body to the earth from whence it was taken
in full assurance of its resurrection from thence at the last day as for
my burial I desire it may be decent without pomp or state at the
discretion of my dear wife and my Executors hereafter named who
I do not will manage it with all requests for as to my worldly
estate I will and positively order that all my Debts to and

from as for my debts an house furniture with and bequeath to
my loving wife Mary three milch cows I leave for John Simpson
where he come to this County to live against next fall twenty
pounds in cash at my decease to be raised off the whole estate also the
one half of the tract of land lying on Jefferson containing two hundred
and fifty acres to be equally divided land and water between my son
Joseph and the above mentioned Simpson also twenty pounds
in cash to my son Joseph to be raised as above mentioned Also

also one feather bed and furniture all the rest of my other
lands I will and bequeath to my sons James, William, Thomas
Samuel and Robert Montgomerie to be equally divided
and all the rest of my Personal estate to be equally divided among
the whole of the legatees except to James my beloved wife and house
hold to William my hope to Thomas my grateful son Samuel my dear
niece to Robert my wife's son and also hereby I authorize and
appoint my sons James William and Samuel Montgomerie
executors or any two of them to see to see and direct after my
decease that the my last will and Testament may be carried into
effect according to the true meaning and intent thereof
