I will and bequeath to my lawfull begotten son David Potts all my Estate both real and personal in land. I Will and order that he and his heirs during from my last sick to the Marriage of my Wife Naomi during her Nathe and life together with Bed and bedding and such other furniture as I possess not here before disposed of by me and becomend the custody of them to my Executors to prevent fraud whithin her hand at her decease I will and order the same to pass to my son David Potts as before mentioned with the tenanted Estate to him and his lawfull begotten heirs forever. I will and bequeath to my lawfull begotten Daughter Sarah Potts twenty Shillings in Money to be paid on demand I will to my grand son John Potts lawfull son to Amos Potts one Dollar to be paid in like manner. I constitute and appoint my son David Potts and my trusty friend Tho. Harbison my Executors. And do by them

Presents Revoked and setting aside former wills made by me here before I am thereby and declare this to be my last will and Testament, signed with my seal and signed with my hand this twentieth ninth day of October 1783 Signed and openly acknowledged by John Potts (L.S.) in presence of

At about held for Lincoln County the 21st day of June 1783 This Will was proved by the oath of William Shaw a witness thereto and ordered to be Recorded and on the motion of David Potts one of the Executors therein named who made oath and executed and acknowledged himself as the law executor a Certificate was granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form.
