I Joseph Lindsay of Lincoln County and State of Virginia being in perfect health and sound in Memory do make and constitute this to be my last Will & Testament first I recommend my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner and my soul I recommend to God who gave it nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God. And touching my worldly Estate wherewith it has been pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give and bequeath to my Loving Wife Ann Lindsay the whole of movable Estate and Negroes now in my possession or to become in my possession by any bargain heretofore made and all money that may be due me for Publick Services also one hundred pounds I owe me by bond from Sam^l Lindsay also one Thousand Ac^{rs} of Land lying in the part of Elk Horn obtained by Certificate from the Commissioners of the district of Kentucky granted to Tullon Lindsay and conveyed to me by a Bill of Sale from said Lindsay bearing date 12th day of April 1781 the said Ann is to pay Tullon Lindsay sum at the time he lives to the age of Twenty one two hundred pounds provided she obtains a legal Title for the same also to pay of the heirs of Wm Page Sen^r secondly I give and bequeath to Joseph Lindsay Jun^r son to Wm Lindsay my own Settlement and five hundred Acres of my plantation adjoining the same to him and his heirs for ever Thirdly I give and bequeath to Tullon Thomson the other five hundred Acres of my plantation adjoining Joseph Lindsay's land and give them a law and bequeath to Lindsay Thomson a State warrant of four hundred Acres Entail joining Robt Thomson's plantation Fifthly I leave and bequeath to my Brother Arthur Lindsay four hundred Acres of land entered in a State warrant in his own name joining his own Settlement of four hundred Acres to him and

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This I do for ever and I appoint my wife Ann Lindsey and my
Brother Wm Lindsey Executors of this my last Will and Testament
in Witness Whereof I have set my hand & Seal this 10th July 1792

Goods God has been pleased to bless me with in this life I give
and devise in manner following to wit, and first I require
that all my just debts be paid or discharged then I give and
bequeath unto Martha W. W. my well beloved Wife one Negro
Man to me from Hubert Taylor and one good Mare to be

and all the clothes furniture as also an equal third of my Cattle
and further she is to have all the utensils for husbandry and
privileges of occupying the plantation I now live on freely
to enjoy during her life and as also a Negro man due to me
from said Taylor then give and bequeath unto my love
