In the Name of God amen the Twentieth day of August 1788
 I William Stewart of Lincoln County and Commonwealth of Virge-
 nia your man being of perfect health, mind, and memory Thanks
 be given to God therefore willing to ante meet the mortality of my
 body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make
 and declare this my last Will and Testament that is to say I give
 fully and first of all I give and Bequeath my soul into the hands of
 Almighty God that give it and my body I commend to the Earth
 to be Buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Execu-
 tors nothing doubting but at the Resurrection I shall receive the
 same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly
 Estate whomever it hath pleased God to bestow on me in this life I give
 demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form
 I give I give and Bequeath unto my well beloved Father two certain
 tracts of Land on the North side of Kentucky containing two thousand
 four hundred Acres one tract known by the name of the of the Truagh
 Spring on the head of Glens Creek the other adjoining or will more
 fully appear by the Records in the Surveyors Office. I give I give
 and my beloved Brother Robert Stewart the sum of five pounds law-
 full money of the Commonwealth of Virginia to be paid out of my
 Estate. I then I give and Bequeath unto my well beloved Sisters
 Hanna and Mary all and singular my Estate not already Be-
 queathed to be equally divided between them the said Hanna and
 Mary and I do hereby constitute Vassha James Hunter John
 Smith & William McBrine ^{Executors} of this my last Will and
 Testament and I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and annul
 all and every other former Testaments Wills Signings and bequests
 and Executors by me in any wise before named Willed and Bequeathed
 Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last
 Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and Seal the day and year above writing
 Signed Seal & delivered by the said W.D. and
 said W.D. Stewart as his last { Executors intended
 before signing }
