Be it Remembered, that I David Hamrick of Logan County and State of Kentucky being very sick and weak in body, but sound in mind and Memory, and knowing that all men have to Die I do ordain and leave, this as my last will and Testament. In the first place I wish to recommend my soul to almighty god who gave it, and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors. — and as for what little property it has pleased god to bless me with in this World I wish it disposed of in the following manner First,

The last will and Testament of David Hamrick was this day exhibited in Court by Peter Hamrick & Elizabeth Hamrick the executors therein named and proved by the oath of Sanford Duncan John. Stolt & Job Hamrick and was ordered to be recorded

July 4<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> 1809 in the name of god I renew I Thomas Bailey being in perfect mind and memory do as my last will and Testament come with my body to the dust from whence it came and my soul to god who gave it in the first place I order that my body shall be buried in a decent and christian manner in the next place I order that all my last debts shall be paid — in the next place I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Jane her living and my house plantation during life I also give her my waggon and gears and all my farming tools with all my house hold and kitchen furniture also four head of horse beasts and lefty the old mare James and several gilly with all the rest of my stock too cattle hogs & sheep all of which is to be at her disposal during life or widowhood (the land only excepted) I also give unto her three negro boys Rhoda Sam and Ben to be at her disposal during life or widowhood except Rhoda which she is to have during life and to be at her disposal at her death Sam and Ben is to be divided between my three male children equally all this property is left in her hand for the support and schooling of my children

to my blood wife I will and bequeath to her, ten wearing apparel one horse, two cows, to be her choice of what I own, her saddle and bridle, with the necessary furniture, likewise ~~the~~ the negro boy Lewis, after the youngest child arrives to the age of fourteen years until that time, his labour is to be for the use of the family in general. Next to my eldest child, and only daughter Polly, I have by will a bed and furniture as for the balance of my personal property, I wish it to be applied to the payment of my just debts, and to the raising and schooling of the children. As for the Bays, I wish them to be bound out to learn, some, Trades, as soon as they severally arrive at the age of fourteen, with this proviso, viz. that they are to get from their respective masters six months schooling when they are between the age of Eighteen, and twenty one years. As to the land I wish the benefits of the Farms to be for the general use and support of the Family, until the youngest child comes to be fourteen years of age, then I wish the land to be sold, and Equally divided amongst my wife, and five children the profit coming to them in their minority may be let to Interest. and if any of them should die in their Minority, their parts to be Equally divided amongst the rest. I do and I hereby appoint and constitute Peter Hansbrough and my wife, sole executors to this my last will and testament. In Witness whereof I have set my hand & Seal This twenty sixth of July In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two - at New Bedford

in the next place I give and bequeath unto my daughter Apollia one negro girl named Ciel to be her maid and her heirs also one round mare, — in the next place I give and bequeath unto my son John Hansbrough one negro man? Hyrum also one gray filly which he now claims also one third part of my large tract of land on the river and also one third part of my home plantation to be divided by lines as to make each part of equal value and then to be given to him by ballot in the next place I give and bequeath to my son Allen one negro named Jacob also the team mares young colts and one third part of the land before mentioned and to be retained by him as appraised in the next place I give and bequeath unto my Son, Cathers one negro child named Rose which at this time is maid in one arm should it come to be fit for service, and that accounts it is to be made good off the rest of my small things which negro is to be her maid and her heirs equally also one horse about equal in value to the rest when she needs it also saddles and bridle to be furnished out of my surplus stock of horses — in the next place I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Gravins one negro of the increase of Choda should there be any otherwise I order that John Hansbrough and Charles Allen shall make him equal with themselves respecting their negroes and horses also his third part of the land in manner and form above mentioned
