The last will and Testament of David Duncan was this day exhibited in Court by Peter Henningshug & Elizabeth Henningshug the executors therein named and proved by the oaths of Sarah Duncan, John Hobbs & Job Hammon and ordered take record. Teste Anna Marshall dec'd

July 2nd 1809 in the name of poor Anna I Thomas Bailey being in perfect mind and memory do as my last will and Testament command my body to the dust ground whence it came and my soul to god who gave it in the first place So in that my body shall埋 in a decent and Christian manner in the next place I order that all my just debts shall be paid in the next place given and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anna her living on my house plantation during life I also give her my waggon and pair and all my farming tools with all my household and kitchen furniture also four Head of horse beasts to be left the old mare Anna and Sowal geldy with all the rest of my stock tool cattle hogs & sheep all of which is to be at her disposal during life or widowhood the land only excepted I also give unto her three negroes tool Rhoda Sam and Ben to be at her disposal during life or widowhood except Rhoda which she is to have during life and to be at her disposal at her death Sam and Ben is to be divided between my three male children equally all this property is left in her hands for the support and schooling of my children

to my beloved wife I will, and bequeath her, her wearing apparel, one horse, creature, to be the choice of what I own, her saddle and bridle, with the necessary furniture, likewise ~~the negro boy Lewis~~, after the youngest child arrives to the age of fourteen years until that time his labour is to be for the use of the Family in general. Next to my eldest child, and only daughter Polly, I here by will a bed and furniture, also the balance of my personal property, I wish it to be applied to the payment of my last debts, and to the Pursing and Schooling of the children, as for the Boys, I wish them to be bound out to service, same trades, as soon as they severally arrive at the age of fourteen, with this provision, viz. that they are to get from their respective masters six months schooling when they are between the age of eighteen, and twenty one years. As to the land I wish the benefits of the same to be, for the general use and support of the Family, until the youngest child comes to of fourteen years of age, then I wish the land to be sold, and equally divided amongst my wife, and five children, the part coming to them in this manner may be left to Interest, and if any of them should die in their minority, their parts to be equally divided among the rest, &c. and I hereby appoint and constitute Peter Hainsburgh and my wife, sole executors to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this twenty sixth of February the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten - acknowledged in presence of us

child name Rose which at this time is maid in and
own shanty to be fit for service, and that
accents it is to be made good off the rest of my male
heirs which negro is to be her and her heirs equally
also are horses both equal in value to the rest when
the negroes also must needs and be stabled to be furnished
out of my surplus Stock of horses - in the next place
I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Gravins one
negro of the increase of Thetha should there be any
otherwise I order that John Thunbury and Charles
Allen shall make them equal with them selves respect
ing their negroes and horses also his third part of
the land in Mares and foams above mentioned

Should any of them negro children die before they are received by their respective owners then the leftenancy to be supplied out of the estate in case of my death there shall be any of the estate in case they must be equally divided among all my children. My tract of land of two hundred acres by me and the muddy timber which I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Givens my tract of land of two hundred and seventy acres acres lying on the waters of pine river, Linn Sizine and bequeath to my nephew James Bailey who is living with me. In witness for the due execution of this my last will and testament I do hereby nominate and impowers my two and trusty friends to be my sole executors whose names is underwritten, to wit, Jane Bailey, Thomas Givens, James Mitchell.
