First of the Estate, in which I am possessed of I wish all my just debts paid. ^{Second} Those of my children that have received any part of my Estate To have and to hold it for their own use and benefit, Third I wish and desire my wife Mary Lockhart to keep the whole of the balance of my Estate during her widowhood. ^{Fourth} I wish and desire each of my children as they severally arrive to the age of maturity or marry to receive of my Estate two negroes one horse bridle and saddle Boots and if my wife should marry during her widowhood I further wish and desire the whole of my Estate then remaining in my wife's hands to sever and distinctly appraise and equally divided amongst First my wife to have her lawful part and 2^d those of my children that have not received as much of my Estate as the others first to receive as much, and then the remainder to be equally divided amongst the whole of my children & when the Lord is pleased to take my wife I wish my Estate to be equally divided as afore said between my children. make this my last will and testament that is to say
principally and first of all I give and recommend
my soul to Almighty God who gave it, and my body
I recommend to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian
burial at the discretion of my friends, nothing doubting
but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such
worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me
in this life, I give demise and dispose of the same in the
following manner and form.

Item, I will that all my Just debts be duly paid

Item, having formerly given to my son George Herndon
two negroes and a tract of land and a considerable

quantity of other property I do not think it would
be just in me to give him any more at this time.

Item, Having given to my son Cornelius Herndon by deed
of gift a Negro woman and a parcel of a Negro child
which he has now in possession by way of advancement
I also think it would be unjust in me to give him any
more at this time.

Item, Having given by way of advancement to my son
Elisha Herndon several Negroes and other property hitherto
for all of which he has the free disposal of. I also
think it would be unjust to give him any thing more
at this time.

Item, having formerly given to my deceased daughter
Martha a negro woman named Sarah which said negro
woman with her negro boy child Amos West, had
to Thomas Proctor & I also but to my said deceased daughter
in her lifetime a certain negro girl Phoebe which is
now in the possession of Amos West my executor

I Give over them I do here, constitute and
 appoint my friends Joseph and Samuel Gray
 my executors in conjunction with my other friends
 John Bussitt Saml Wilson and Edward Gind
 but it is my wish and desire that my said friends
