I Item Ith after my wife's death I will that all the debts heretofore made shall be paid Excepted that is that each to whom I have devised any thing shall have possession of the property by me herein devised & then I will that my son John shall have his choice of any negroes that may belong to my estate which he shall then take possession of & have to him & his heirs forever and thus it is my will that all the rest and residue of my estate shall be equally divided between my daughter and four (my son James excepted) but between my daughters Lucy Fanny Betty Polly and my sons (Philip) John and Robert each having an equal portion share and share alike But that part which may fall to the share of my daughter Betty I will to my son John in trust for the use & benefit and interest of my said daughter ^{Betty} and her heirs forever during her present existence or the minority of her children if she should not survive her husband after either of which events the trust to cease and the property to become hers absolutely if she survives her husband or her children if she does not as soon as they arrive at age

Item 16th It is my will and desire that if any dispute should arise between any of my children about this will or any matter or thing which may grow out of the same that the Circuit Court of this County or in case of its abolition any other Court possessing similar jurisdiction in chancery cases in the County should appoint three arbitrators to settle the same whose decision I will shall be absolutely final and the property shall go to whomsoever they may decide in favor of

Eighthly I give to my wife all the remaining
property I am possessed of to be at her

Disposal during her life and at her Death
I devise that all the property she dies possessed
of except what is otherwise devised, be
Divided among my Children and my son

His Children in the following manner

First My son Lawrence Ely is charged
with fifty Dollars My son Edward Ely
is to pay one hundred Dollars My son
Law Elisha Collins is to discount two

hundred Dollars and My son in law George Brown
is to discount one hundred Dollars making in
all four hundred and fifty Dollars which sum
is to be divided in to four equal parts and my son
