

I Ephraim McLean of Logan County and State of Kentucky do this nineteenth day of January 1813 make and publish this codicil to my last Will and Testament in manner and form following Viz: Whereas in and by my last Will and Testament I have devised two adjoining tracts of Land one of which I now live to be sold and Whereas there are three tracts of Land in the connection and one of them being only four acres and one I had not recollected it was not apart of either of said adjoining tracts and intending to direct and authorize the sale of the tracts of said connection of tracts as hereafter more fully and in order and declare that my Will is that the whole of the three tracts of Land adjoining each other in which I now live be sold in the same manner under the same regulations and for the same purposes as the two tracts are in my last Will and Testament directed to be sold And it is further my Will that the School House built on my land near the S.W. of the blackish creek be supposed to be and as a school house under the regulations of my Executors and Executors And lastly, it is my Will that this present codicil be annexed to make apart of my last will and Testament to all intents and purposes

I Ephraim McLean of the County of Logan and State of Kentucky being mindful of the uncertainty of this mortal life but of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following Viz: It is my Will that all of the two tracts of Land connected and adjoining one another are one of which I now live be sold at private sale and at a credit of twelve months from the day of sale for as many and the amount of the proceeds of such sale to be divided into four equal portions or parts one of which said equal parts to be given to each of my sons John William and Charles and the remaining equal part to be applied to the use of my wife and other children also

give to my dear John my negroes Bay & Henry
my Saddle and great Coat to my dear Wilson
I also give my negroes boy Abner and the
horse and mare commonly by called the young
son to Charles. I also give my negroes Bay & Henry
and the same commonly called by the rest
and residue of my Land all other property
of every description whatsoever now therein be
to the fore mentioned I give devise an Bequeath
unto my Wife and other children for and
during life of my wife only and at her decease
I give the said real & personal estate to be sold
to all my sons now herein be to the fore mentioned
by name but not however to the foregoing
condition that each child when he or she
attains to the age of twenty one years or more
shall receive such part as of my said property
as to my Executor and Executors may be deemed
proper not however altering the disposal
before mentioned of any part of my Land and
it is my Will the property be left together
so far as may be done consistently with the
above disposition thereof and lastly it is my
will that my friends James Wilson Tucker
Bayless and Jacob W. Walker and my wife Eliza
be and they are hereby appointed Executors and

and Executors of this my last will and Testame
nt. a majority of them as in case of death
a majority of the Survivors are to execute and
all important matters and affairs growing out
