and Paul C. Carrington and Joseph Carrington of the
State of Virginia, all my estate real and personal
which may pass or may be entitled to by any
means whatsoever at the time of my death
that is to say, to my said three Daughters, each
one fourth of my estate and to the said Fry, Paul C.
& Joseph Carrington the other one fourth, to my
said Daughters and their heirs forever and to the said

Virginia, City of Richmond to wit

I possess during he natural life like wife all
and every species of my other property to her and
to be disposed of as she may think proper
To my Brother Charles Bailey I leave the land
at the decease of my Mother to him and his heirs
forever. To my sister Nancy Bailey I leave
the oronoko land mare. I do hereby constitute
my mother my Executor to this my last
