my beloved wife Mary Morgan to be at her disposal as  
she may think fit. Also Be it Remembered that the money  
arising from my locations made in the Territory South of the  
River Ohio located by Intendant Ben Lottright and transferred  
by him to me I say said money to be put into the publick Treasury  
of the State of Kentucky and there to remain untill my two  
children Susannah and Amos Morgan severally come  
to age or many at the same time Be it Remembered that  
the annul interest of said money are to be called for by my  
Executors or as often as they may see proper and the  
same to be disposed of to the best advantage equally between  
my wife and two children as above named to their maintenance  
and in a most particular manner to the use of schooling  
my children. Be it known that I hereby Appoint my Beloved  
wife Mary Morgan Capt John Morgan Herb H. Craft  
Executors and executrix Also Mary Morgan and  
of this my Last Will and Testament hereby recording  
and every other Will and Testament by me hereafter

being found in mind the weak in body do make this my last  
Will and testament In presence I have unto my loving Wife Mary  
Mitchell all my estate both real and personal untill my youngest  
son comes of age and then comfortable maintenance at the discre-  
tion of my Executors provided The Executors a woman and of the said  
Mary either before or after my youngest son comes of age my Will  
and desire is that she should have no part of my estate more  
than the law will give her my Will and desire is that my children  
be all schooled and raised at expence of my Wife and Executors  
Out of the profits of my estate my Will and desire is that no  
part of my estate be divided amongst my children untill my youngest  
son comes of age except each of my sons as they come of age a  
horse worth eighteen pounds and a common serviceable saddle  
and Bridle likewise to each of my daughters as they come of age  
a feather Bed and furniture like saddle and one good Cow &  
half my Will is when my youngest son comes of age my estate both  
real and personal to be divided amongst my sons and daughters  
leaving my Wife a comfortable maintenance and at her death  
the part allotted to my sons to give to them and their heirs for ever the  
part allotted to my daughters to give to them and to their  
children at their deaths my Will and desire is that all  
money that I now have by me or may be collected be put into  
the hands of my wife Mary Mitchell to lay out in lands  
or property for my children at the direction of my Executors my  
Will and desire is that my wife shall not be called on to  
give an account or sale of any money that I now have or  
that she may collect hereafter nor to give security for any  
money that may come into her hands except she  
wishes my Will and desire is that as soon as
