 have one bed and furniture when they marry or
 leave their mother. I wish the property to be carefully kept
 and not wasted or made away with, if my wife can
 make payment for the balance I owe for the land
 she may keep the two horses & two steers, if not they
 must be sold to pay that debt lastly I appoint
 John McDaniel & Jeremiah Ward my whole and sole

Then I give unto my Brother Thomas Johnston my Negro
man David, his wife Milla Kate and Harris also
