 I do hereby appoint John Wood & David Wood my Executors it is my Will & desire that my said Executors pay all my just debts if any I have and lawfully I then Will and bequeath to my son David Wood his hundred dollars & a few shalps for his daughter Sindersted one I allow any of my other children I then Will I bequeath saye Wood & Belton shill three shillings to each & no more unless Belton shill should come to the County then I am that case I will I bequeath the said Belton shill fifty dollars to be paid by my executors but not otherwise I also Will I bequeath all the residue of my property both real & personal including all debts that may be due and to my children namely eddy Ogden Betty Barker John Wood Thomas Wood & David Wood to be equally divided amongst them and I also money whereof I the said Lashly Mord do hereby promise this to be my last Will & Testament my witness whereof I the said Lashly Mord hath set his hand & seal this 15 day of August 1809 A.D.
