I now a second consideration I do hereby alter that part of my will respecting my negro Dick I do will and bequeath said negro to my daughter Locky during at her marriage provided she pays to her mother 20 dollars for years of service as she requires it to pay the taxes and other expenses during said widow's life Also I will and bequeath to the said Locky one more feather Bed and furniture and my black Walnut chest Also my son Saml during is to pay out of his share equal share of the divided three pounds in trade to Henry Bond and Also my son John during is to pay out of his share three pounds unto Samuel Bayan Also the widow is to have no means to dispose of my by gift or otherwise no part of the property left in her hands without the consent of some two of my Brothers always including one or more of the executors and at my death my two executors to Chatham and Robert during is to take an Inventory of all my estate and keep it in their own hands exclusive of the Inventory recorded in Court Also my son John to ~~discharge~~ my new claims of lands of my purchase, he claiming out the same himself Witness my hand as above

1/ This my Codicil to be annexed to my will dated the 20th of September 1803 I give and bequeath to said Robertus having a bond that I have an Samuel Caldwell for one hundred dollar horse in law of the first rate tract of land mentioned in my will also my bond horse in law of the second Bond of fifty dollars that I got from said Robertus on Monday I also give and bequeath to my wife my bay M^{rs} M^{rs} horse in law of S^r Brown horse I also release my daughter Locky bearing from the twenty dollar for year as stated in my will of 1800 I give and bequeath to my brother Chatham having one hundred dollar horse to be paid by said Locky B^r having out of that part of my estate that I have willed to her at the death of her mother and it is also my will and desire that all my other estate both real personal and mixed that is not mentioned in my will or this my codicil be equally divided between my living children at the death of my wife whereof I have written for my hand and Affixed my seal this day of December 1803.

The executor states that the negro man named Bob belonging to the estate of John Ewing deceased was hired for a year in 1865 in John Ewing and Robert Ewing for the sum of 75 Dollars which sum they have paid to the widow toward her support and for the year 1866 the negro was hired to Robert and Chatham Ewing for the same sum paid for the same use, the year 1864 the negro was hired to Augustus Portland for which he supported the widow her son Robert or least so far as he the negro was worth and the negro woman Rachel the widow hired this year to Mr. Hannum and appropriated the benefit thereof to herself and her son John who signed - Robert & Chatham Ewing Executors.
