I Josiah Milcox of the County
of Logan & State of Kentucky. Being very sick and
Milcox weak but in perfect mind and memory thanks to
Will unto god - Calling unto mind the mortality of my body
and knowing it appointed for all men once to die,
do make and ordain this my last will and testament,
That is to say principally and first of all, I give
and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty
god that gave it and my body I recommend to the
Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial
at the discretion of my Executors; nothing doubting
But at the general resurrection I shall receive
the same again by the mighty power of god - and
as touching such worldly estate Wherewith it hath
pleased god to bless me in this life. I give devise
and dispose of the same in the following manner

and form

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved
wife Eleanor Milcox my paternal estate wherewith I now live
during her natural life and at her death to be divided
Equally between my two sons Charles Grandson Milcox
and Nathan Miles Milcox

Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my wife Eleanor all my
family of negroes viz. Harry & Lucy and their Children named
as follows: David & Susan Lucy & Venice Capital & Bonds
and their Increase during her life and then to be Equally
by lot or otherwise Divided between my three daughters
namely Effie Amanda Melrose Milcox and Emmile
& Angelina Milcox and Anna Commentener Milcox -
Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Eleanor
all my personal Estate of all Descriptions after all my just
Debts are paid Whereto I likewise constitute make and
ordain With John Breathitt my sole Executors and Ad-
ministrators - Confirming this and no other my last will
and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal this fifteenth day of October in
year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen

pronounced and declared by the
said Josiah Milcox as his last
will and testament in the pre-
sence of us who in his presence
and in the presence of each other
have herebefore subscribed our names
