Kentucky and Legum County I Will sick and weak in body but
perpet mine and memory thanks be to God for his mercy, Sheweth
Sheweth that it is appointed for all men once to die I Recommend my
body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be buried in as Christian
like and decent manner, and my soul into the hands of God who gave it
and touching such worldly goods whereunto it hath pleased God to
bless me with in this life - I dispose of the same in the manner and
form following to wit - First it is my will that all my just debts
and funeral charges be paid at the discretion of my Executors &c
Then the first it is my will that my beloved wife Anne Sheweth &c
have the benefit of the plantation whereon I now live for the benefit
of herself and the small children and to the raising of them this
during her life or widowhood and after her death or marriage it
is my will that the plantation should be sold and the money arising
thereon to be divided amongst my children undernamed To wit James
and Polly and Sally and Ruth until they are made Quir with Anne
and William Sheweth whose part which he has received and amounts to
two hundred dollars and seventy five cents which sum my four
sons unless to wit Alexander Sheweth Lewis William Andrew Harris &
William Harris has received and if there be an overplus after the
above named small children now under my jurisdiction are made
equal as above said then the overplus as above said to be equally

divided amongst all my living heirs. Item 3^d It is my will that my wife should have one black mare which I got from Edward ~~Smith~~ live cows her choice of my whole stock also her saddle and bridle her bed and furniture and her pot or Dutch oven her choice out of both pots and ovens one flat iron and spinning wheel. ^{little two} ^{black off} ^{so} ^{but} ^{that} ^{she} ^{should} ^{have} ^{the} ^{sole} ^{management} ^{of} ^{all} ^{my} ^{little} ^{sheep} ^{and} ^{hogs} ^{until} ^{her} ^{death} ^{or} ^{marriage} ^{to} ^{dispose} ^{of} ^{to} ^{the} ^{smaller} ^{children} ^{as} ^{the} ^{share} ^{and} ^{together} ^{with} ^{all} ^{my} ^{household} ^{furniture} &c.

Item 3^d It is my will that my negro man called Jupiter should be the property of my wife during her life or widowhood in order to help raise the children and after her death or marriage that he shall be sold and my wife to have one third of the price and the overplus to be equally divided between James Strider Polly Strider Sally and Ricket Strider and that my wife shall be at liberty to do with her third as she may think proper at her death.

Item 4th It is my will my daughter Janet should be made equal with Jettelard Harris Right I have my sons in law - 5th It is my will that my daughter Polly should have one horse at one hundred dollars value one bed and furniture together with other necessary household furniture - 6th It is my will that my daughter Sally should have one hundred dollar horse from Andrew Harris for which I have his note in Sallys name together with a saddle and bridle worth twenty in cash also one bed and furniture - 7th It is my will that my daughter Ruth should have one hundred dollar horse from Andrew Harris for which I have his note in Ruths name together with a saddle and bridle worth twenty dollars in cash also one bed and furniture and other necessary household furniture and fifty dollars in cash extra between Ruth and Sally if it can be collected due to me from my father Estate - 8th Lastly It is my will that if there be any property of any kind that is not of Personal goods to my wife, that she shall be at liberty. It is my will that my daughter Ruth shall have 16 dollars ~~more~~ ^{than} any of the rest of my children. To sell &c. property at publick sale and convert said money to the use of the children & myself And now I constitute and appoint my wife and will

belove wife Nancy Strider, and my friend John Taylor the Executor of this my last will and testament. Hearing and Disallowing all other former wills or testaments by me made Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament In Witness whereunto him the said Robert Strider hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this twenty second day of October in the year of our Lord 1812
