(To wit) One negro Girl named Eady And one third part  
of my goods and Chattles except my largest stud horse  
and a mare and two colts called Tommy. Also my  
Plantations. Secondly I give and bequeath to my eld-  
son Thomas Hamilton One negro man named Joe  
also One sorrel mare that have been called his hestep  
and two colts that mare have had since she was called  
his I give to said Thomas also give largest stud horse  
called King Sammony to my said son Thomas Hamilton  
but half the seasons of 1<sup>st</sup> Horse until 1<sup>st</sup> son Thomas  
be of full age I will to the to my other children—

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son Charles Hamilton  
a negro boy named Joe, fourthly I give and bequeath  
to my son John Hamilton a negro Boy named Bill  
fifthly I give the bequeath to my son Benjamin Hamilton  
a negro Boy named Jim.

Sixthly I will to my son Waid Hamilton a negro Woman  
named Shelay. Seventhly I will to my son Litz Ham-  
ton the negro girl that I have willed to the use of my  
wife, after her decease or Widowhood to be the said son  
Litz Hamiltons property And Whereas my wife susannah  
Hamilton is now pregnant if she shall live to bring  
a living child I will that the first child that the  
negro Woman named Shelay shall bear shall be its  
property And if said Shelay should not have any more  
children I will the first that Eady shall bear as  
above And further I will that the increase of

Two negroes be equally divided among my children equally  
provided that it be understood that each child as they come to  
full age shall have possession of What is willed to them  
I will that my estate in lands be equally divided among  
my boys What I may hold exclusive of the land I now live  
on I that also to be divided equally among them after  
my wifes death or Widowhood. I will also that all my goods  
and Chattles be equally divided among my children except  
the Horses that name a Wille to Tommy my Eldest son  
I will that my children be kept together with my wife  
and school and maintained out of the estate not particularly  
willed to an individual of them ~~I Thomas~~

~~I do~~ <sup>and appoint</sup> I will constitute Thomas Waid to John  
Shelton my lawfull executor I will that all my just debts  
be paid out of the money due to me and the balance  
to my children

In the name of God. Amen I Robert Baker of Logan County and  
State of Kentucky being very sick and weak in body but of perfect  
mind and memory, Thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind  
the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for  
all men once to die, do make And Ordain this my last will  
and Testament, that it to my friends and just of all

I give and recommend my soul into the hand of ~~God~~ <sup>Almighty</sup> God that gave it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be Buried in or about Churchyard burial, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly estate as I have at present left to help me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following Manner and Form

First I leave to Sarah Baker my dearly beloved wife the Land and mansion wherewith I now live during her natural life, Except heretofore I have given my son Robert Baker for love & good at her desire I give it to my well beloved son John Baker for love Also I leave to my wife Sarah two negro women <sup>negro</sup> Polly and another a boy called Ben and a girl named Jimmy and at her death I give the same to my four Childen to be equally divided amongst them So as will best suit each other and it is my desire that none of them shall be sold out of the family. And if the above negroes and their increase should make more then four at my wife's decease, I give it to be equally divided betwixt my son John and Royal Bailey. Also I leave to my daughter Betsey Sudley a negro woman by the name of Hannah during her natural life and at her death I give Hannah and her increase to the Children of Betsey Sudley. Also I leave to my Daughter Polly Blanton a negro girl named Kate and at her decease I give the said Kate and her increase to her four Children viz. Patsy Sally Joseph and Robert Payne Also I give to my Daughter Peggy Atwell and her heirs a negro girl named Emily Also I give to my son Samuel Baker a negro girl by the

name of Lucie, I give to my son William Baker a negro boy by the name of Peter I give to my Daughter Emily Statham a negro girl by the name of Grace I give to my son Robert Baker a negro boy named Adams and twenty Acres of Land whereon his home now stands I give to my son John Baker two small negroes viz. Stephen & Felix my black Smiths boy and four Acre of barren, battle and boggy Land for the use of the plantation (This four excepted) I give to my Daughter Sally, Obedy two negroes viz. Lett and Jane two cows and hogs & also I do hereby fully disallow, revoke and disannul any other <sup>former</sup> testaments and do appoint my son John Baker and Royal Bailey Executors of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourteenth day of February in the year of our Lord and Saviour
