In the name of God, Amen, I James Brim of Logan County in the State of Kentucky, being weak in body, but of a disposing mind, and giving thanks be given to God, am willing to mind the Mortality of my body, knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and bequeath my soul to God, and my body to the Earth to be buried without pomp in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my friends. Also touching such Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

Now, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Ann Brim, one feather bed & furniture & one lay man saddle & bridle to be at her disposal forever. I also give her during her natural life or widowhood the mansion house & two hundred acres of land to which I now live for her & my son Archy Brim to live on & raise & school my three youngest sons (to wit) John B. Brim James B. Brim & Alfred M. Brim. And at her death or if she should marry to another man then I give the house land & all the improvements to my two sons Archy Brim and Alfred M. Brim their heirs &c. forever to be equally divided between them. I also give to my said wife Ann Brim my cupboard and furniture belonging thereto Also one bureau and her three chairs

Cow and Calves out of my stock. Also four sides & lambs her choice of my stock and two sows & pigs her choice also I will that she retain unsold after my decease a sufficient quantity of Horses and big cattle and grain of all kinds for the plentiful support of herself & family until they can raise another crop — Also if my said wife should never marry then and in that case she is to have the free disposal of the Cupboard & furniture bureau & other things cows & calves four Cows & horses & two sows & pigs and increase or what of them shall remain as she may think proper otherwise at her Marriage I will that they all be disposed of for the benefit of my Children or their heirs — Also I give to my said wife & son Archy Brinn one work horse called Dick live yrs of years & one plow for the use of the family Also I give to my said wife one large kettle one pot & oven of the Kitchen furniture at her disposal forever —

Now I will that the rest of my household & Kitchen furniture my stock of all kinds of Wagon & gear and plantation tools (except such as I may hereafter particularly name) be sold at publick vendue at twelve months Credit — And the money arising therefrom to be applied in manner hereafter described —

Now I give to my eldest son Robert Brinn fifty Dollars to be paid him by my Executors out of money collected from sale of my Estate —

Now I give to my son William Brinn one hundred Dollars to be paid him in like manner —

Now Having given to my son Daniel Brinn as much of my Estate as I ever intended I now give him five Dollars to be paid him as above —

Now I give to my daughter Jane Mitchell fifty Dollars to be paid her by my Executors as above —

Now I give to my daughter Sarah Rigg one hundred Dollars to be paid as above described —

Now I give to my son Lytle Brinn one horse saddle and

bridle all to be worth twenty five Dollars and to be paid him when he is clear of the Army by my Executors <sup>as above</sup> Now I give to my son James Brinn the use of blacksmith tools that he now is working on and the horse saddle and bridle now in his possession for ever —

Now I give to my son Archy Brinn the man saddle and bridle now in his possession —

Now I give to my son John Brinn one horse saddle and bridle all to be worth twenty five Dollars and to be paid him by my Executors when he is free from his apprenticeship — Also fifty Dollars in money at this same time —

I will that my two sons Joseph M. Brinn & King C. Brinn after being sufficiently educated have the liberty of learning any trade they may choose or working on the farm and live with their mother until they are one of full age — and in case they go to a trade then they are to have a horse saddle & bridle worth in all twenty five Dollars each, and then to each fifty dollars in money to be paid as above described to others But in case they choose to stay on the farm until they are become of full age then they are to have a horse saddle and bridle as above each and each to have at her death or when they become of full age the value of one fourth part of my said tract of two hundred acres of land to be paid by my two sons Archy and Alfred M. Brinn who is to have the land at the death of their mother —

Now after educating my son Alfred M. Brinn and he become of full age I give him a horse saddle and bridle all worth twenty five Dollars and half the land at the death of his mother after ~~paying~~ <sup>paying</sup> and paying his brother as above described all of which Legacies I give to each of my children and their heirs forever —

Now I will that all debts owing to me be collected by my Executors and that all my last debts be paid by them —

Cow and Calves out of my stock. Now Having given to my son Daniel Brinn as much of my Estate as I ever intended I now give him five Dollars to be paid him as above —

Now I give to my daughter Jane Mitchell fifty Dollars to be paid her by my Executors as above —

Now I give to my daughter Sarah Rigg one hundred Dollars to be paid as above described —

Now I give to my son Lytle Brinn one horse saddle and

bridle all to be worth twenty five Dollars and to be paid him when he is clear of the Army by my Executors <sup>as above</sup> Now I give to my son James Brinn the set of blacksmith tools that he now is working on and the horse saddle and bridle now in his possession for ever —

Now I give to my son Archy Brinn the man saddle and bridle now in his possession —

Now I give to my son John Brinn one horse saddle and bridle all to be worth twenty five Dollars and to be paid him by my Executors when he is free from his apprenticeship — Also fifty Dollars in money at this same time —
