To my second son John P Warfield I give and bequeath one of the aforesaid Shares. To my third son Nicholas Warfield I give and bequeath one of the aforesaid Shares. And to my Daughter Elizabeth A Warfield I give and bequeath two of the aforesaid Shares and I constitute and appoint my friend Hunt Wilson to be my sole Executor for this my last will and Testament - I recommend George Brown of Russellville to be Guardian to my son John who lives with him of I recommend Thos Van Swearingen to be Guardian to my son Nicholas and Mordecai Sams to be Guardian to my Daughter Betsey my son Charles being of age I leave him to chose his Guardian Signed Sealed and sworn in the presence of

In the name of God Amen I Stephen Johnson of Logan County State of Kentucky, being weak of body but of sound mind, thank be to God and calling to mind the uncertainty of the time I may live, do make and constitute this my Last will and Testament, in manner following, that is to say First I Give my soul to God who gave it, in sure and certain hopes of rising at the last day through the merits of Jesus Christ, and my body to the Saints to be buried at the discretion of my executor, As to the worldly Goods which I may be in possession of at the time of my decease, I bequeath as follows: First I give and bequeath to my dear wife Francis Pelghmans all my house hold and Kitchen Furniture and also all the stock of cattle, and one negro woman named Abby to be disposed of at her death as she pleases. 2^d I give and bequeath to my son Joshua Pelghmans of the State of North Carolina a tract of Land whereon I lately lived on the Catawba River in Michlinburg County State last aforesaid to him and his heirs forever, And also all my Cash notes due me in that State and one short Gun and the

And last of my wearing apparel and forty dollars in cash to be laid out of my estate. Kentucky but it is my will and desire that the last mentioned sum of money is to be appropriated to the education of my grand son Stephen & Telfman and at the decease of my son Joshua the first fund to be given to my said grand son Telfman Joshua Telfman his heirs forever.

Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Standard one hundred dollars in cash to be paid her by my Executors out of the sale of my estate, soon as can be collected.

And my will and desire is that my land in Logan County I will to be sold at twelve months credit and my negroes not heretofore devised to wids Guy, Jack, Roddy & her child and negro boy Monday, I desire to say be sold at twelve months, so that the negro Gire, Roddy & her child be not separated but sold together. And I further will and desire that my, my horse, tools of every description and every other article of property in my possession not heretofore bequeathed be sold at like credit of twelve months, and the cash when collected after pay my just debts to be equally between my three children George Telfman, Gideon Telfman & Polly Telfman and also the debts are one whereof collected to be divided in the last mentioned manner. And my will and desire is that the hat and of wearing apparel not heretofore devised to be equally divided between my

sons George & Gideon my daughter John Standard and I appoint my friend Amos A. Morehead of Logan County my son Gideon Telfman executor of this my last will and Testament revoking all other wills by me heretofore made, I do hereby solemnly declare & pronounce this my last will & Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed the same with my own hand & affixed my seal on the 8th day of January 1810
