At a County Court held for Logan County on the 18th of Nov. 1816 the petition appraisement of the Estate of Sally Ragsdale decd. was read in Court and ordered to be recorded. Teste James and others

In the name of God, Amen, I James Brinn of Logan County in the State of Kentucky, being weak in body, but of a disposing mind, and knowing thanks be given to God, and willing to mind the Mortality of my body, & knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and bequeath my soul to God, and my body to the Earth to be buried without pomp in some Christian burial at the discretion of my friends. After touching such Estate as it hath please God to bless me with in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

Now, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Ann Brinn, one feather bed & furniture & one bay mare saddle & bridle to be at her disposal forever. I also give her during her natural life or widowhood the plantation house & two hundred acres of land wherein I now live for her & my son Archy Brinn to live on & raise & school my three youngest sons (to wit) Jonathan B. Brinn James B. Brinn & Alfred M. Brinn. And at her death or if she should marry to another man then I give the house land & all the improvements to my two sons Archy Brinn and Alfred M. Brinn their heirs &c. forever to be equally divided between them. I also give to my said wife Ann Brinn my cupboard and furniture belonging thereto Also one bureau and her three chairs
