

County of Logan, being in a weak state of Body, but of a sound mind; and taking into consideration the certainty of death, and in the full belief of future rewards and punishments, do I solemnly resign my soul to God who gave it and my body to be decently interred at the discretion of my Relatives, and in regard of the worldly goods which God hath given me I will that of them all my just debts together with my funeral expenses be paid - I will and bequeath to my well beloved wife Mary all my household furniture except a big pot and one oven and I will to her, her riding saddle and bridle, and her choice of all the horse, beasts on the day of sale, and two cows and one heifer according to her choice, and one beef steer, and all the flax and cotton and shew bathen, I will and bequeath to my well beloved son James Patch my riding saddle, and one ox. I will and bequeath to my well beloved son Michael Darye Henderson one ox. I will and bequeath to my well beloved son Thomas Calveris one cow, none of all the above articles to be exposed to sale. I will that all the rest of my perishable property be exposed to public sale, and the money to be put to interest and to be collected as my Father, Michael Henderson, and my Father in Law, James Patch, shall judge necessary for the schooling or support of my children as I have chosen them for Gardening for my children and whatever of said money may remain from such necessary expenses to be equally divided amongst my four children, still as they come of age - moreover I do sincerely desire and appoint Mr. Samuel Wilson and Mr. Daniel McGoarins to be the Executors of this my last will and testament signed and dated in the presence of Michael Henderson, Andrew Henderson, James Patch, Thomas Henderson his

X In the name of God amen I William Hendry of Logan County State of Kentucky, the weak in body being perfect in mind and memory do hereby make & appoint this my last will and testament as follows to wit: I bequeath to my wife Betsey Hendry I leave & bequeath the plantation whereon I now live with the following negroes viz. Tom, Mah, Sall, May, & James with the stock of Cattle of all kind and farming utensils to her during her natural life or widowhood as also all my household & kitchen furniture at her disposal. she undertaking to raise and Educate my children in a decent and orderly manner and Give to each of my children when they shall come of age or marry one good Bed and to each of my Daughters one young horse or mare, To my son John I leave one half of the land I have in Howard County Saline creek Township also one Negro boy named Anthony to him and his being the Ballance of said Land to be Equally divided Between my sons Robert & Charles, to Robert I further leave one Negro Boy named David, to Charles I leave one Negro boy named Nelson. To each of my daughters I leave as follows To my Daughter Catharine I bequeath one Negro girl named Melinda, to Mary I leave one Negro girl named Lela. To my Daughter Elizabeth I leave one

Negro girls named Roder, and it is my will, that each of my Daughters shall have one young Negro out of the increase of the Negroes that I leave in the hands of my wife as soon as they can be had. I leave the plantations whereon I now live consisting of 300 acres to be Equally divided between my two youngest sons James & William To James I further leave one Negro boy named George and to William I leave one young Negro or the worth of one over and above his share. I leave the above named five Negroes without the hands of my wife at her decease to be equally divided among my five sons as also the horses & farming utensils to be equally divided as above, the cattle and other stock to be equally divided among all my children, to my will that should either or any of my children die without lawfull excuse of their body, their part or share to be equally divided among my surviving children. I further my will that should any of the particular bequeathed Negroes die before they come into the hands of the children which they are given that their value shall be made up to them out of the increase of the Negroes in the hands of my wife. I do hereby authorize and appoint my beloved wife Betty Bendry John Bendry & Philip Kennedy Executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby revoke all other wills by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 24th Day of July 1811 In the presence of

In the name of God Amen I William Trigel of Logan County State of Kentucky being afflicted in body yet sound in memory and mind, and knowing it is appointed once for all men to die, do ordain this as my last will and Testament. I Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Deliah Trigel the tract of land whereon I now live during her natural life or widowhood, also a bay mare called Kate and a black horse called Bob likewise all the house hold and kitchen furniture and one cow and calf, in short the stock of cattle and hogs to continue in her care so long as they her children may live together and after her death or marriage each Daughter to have a cow and calf. If the value of the stock will amount thereto I Item I give and bequeath to my son James Trigel the tract of land named to my wife Deliah Trigel after her death or marriage also the Wagon and plantation utensils of each and every kind all of which the the Wagon Excepted shall be his after the death of my Mother and the wagon to be equally divided between each of my surviving daughters (To wit) Rachel, Leticia, Nancy and Sally. I Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Leticia Trigel one Brown mare colt - I Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rachel Trigel one Brown horse colt - I Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Trigel one bay Spring colt one Rifle gun not before named give to my son James Trigel without Reserve of any
