In the name of God Amen I Stephen Johnson of Logan County State of Kentucky, being weak of body but of sound mind thank be to God and calling to mind the uncertainty of the time I may live, do make and constitute this my Last will and Testament, in manner following, that is to say First I Give my soul to God who gave it, in sure and certain hopes of rising at the last day through the merits of Jesus Christ, and my body to the Saints to be buried at the discretion of my executor, As to the worldly Goods which I may be in possession of at the time of my decease, I bequeath as follows: First I give and bequeath to my dear wife Francis Pelghmans all my house holds and Kitchen Furniture and also all the stock of cattle, and one negro woman named Abby to be disposed of at her death as she pleases. 2nd I give and bequeath to my son Joshua Pelghmans of the State of North Carolina a tract of Land whereon I lately lived on the Catawba River in Michlinburg County State last aforesaid to him and his heirs forever, And also all my Cash notes due me in that State and one shot Gun and the

A Shroth will in Legal Form

In the name of god amen. I Henry Hambrick of  
the County Logan and State of Kentucky being very  
sick and weak but of perfect mind and memory  
thanks given unto God for his mercies calling unto  
mind the mortality of the body and knowing that  
it is appointed for all men once to die do make  
and ordain this my last will and testament that  
is to say principally and first of all I give and  
recommend my Soul into the hand of Almighty god  
that give it and my body I recommend to the  
earth to be buried in decent christian burial  
at the discretion of my friends and as touching  
worldly things I give dispose and dispose of the  
same in the following manner and from my  
debts first to be discharged and then the balance of  
my property moveable and immoveable to be equally  
divided betwixt four of my Sons whose names is  
as following John Joseph Adam Daniel only forty  
dollars to be deducted out of Johns part there is two  
of my Sons George and Henry each of with one  
dollar each for them have receive there portions

of the County of Logan & State of Kentucky being  
in perfect sense and memory to make and ord-  
ain this my last will and Testament in manner  
and form following. First It is my will and  
desire that all my Just debts be paid and disch-  
arged out of the Hire of my Negroes before my  
Division of the same shall take place. Then  
I give unto my beloved wife Ann Johnston  
two hundred acres of the tract of land on which  
I now live to be laid off on the Southern part  
of the tract by a line running parallel with the  
Southern boundary line, also the following Slaves  
& their future increase viz Sawney, well, Isham  
Rachel, Nan Jane, Jackson, Sarah, Sam, Leper  
son of Rachel, and Kitty, also all my stock of every  
kind, Horses, cattle, sheep & Pigs, except an Horse  
of twenty Pound value all my house hold and  
Kitchen Furniture of every kind, and all my  
Plantation and Farming utensils, of every kind  
also my riding carriage to her and her heirs forever  
Then I give unto my Brother Thomas Johnston my Negro  
man David, his wife Milla Kate and Harris also

the Balance of the tract of land on which I now live not willed to my wife Ann, to him his heirs and assigns forever Reserving fifty acres of this land willed to my brother Thomas, the lands off lay a fair division for the use of my Brother Richard Johnson in case he shall please to live thereon During the life of my said Brother Richard. Item It is my will and desire that my negro man Isaac Kimm be hired out annually by my Executors & the hire to be applied to the support of my Brother Richard Johnson during his natural life and at his said Richard's death I give said negro Isaac Kimm to my Brother Thomas Johnson, to him & his heirs forever Item It is my will and desire that my negro woman Lucy and her children, Isbell, Charity and Ottomero, and any other children she may have, be sold by my Executors to the highest bidder at twelve month's credit and the money arising from the sale I give to my nephew William Johnson, son of my Brother John Johnson, to him and his heirs, except fifty pounds thereof which fifty pounds I leave in the hands of my Executors for the use and benefit of my sister Abigail Jones to be sent her by my Executors or paid to her order Item I give also to my nephew William Johnson a horse worth twenty pounds and a good many saddle, scowls, tools, and appoint my Beloved wife Ann Executrix and my Brother Thomas Johnson Executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifteenth day of September Anno Domini 1811

Witnessed my will and desire is that my beloved wife Ann have the two hundred acres of land which I have devised to her in the foregoing will laid off by a line quite across the tract I live on, parallel with the line which joins or binds our Montong military land, so as to include the House I also give to my beloved wife Ann all the crop which is now growing on the tract of land on which I live to her & her heirs forever. In witness my hand and seal this 25<sup>th</sup> day of September 1811
