named to dispose of the rest of my property both real

and Personal at public auction to collect all my outstanding debts and pay out of the proceeds of sales and collections all my just debts and, pay of the deficient legatees their respective legacies. And then the balance equally between my daughter Nancy and Mary an hundred my son George gets the the stay house. Then the same money how ever he must give up to my daughter Nancy and Mary and my executors are hereby directed to give him the said George the price of two good cows and calves out of the sales and collections.
