senses, but calling to mind the mortality of the body
and that it is appointed for all men once to die
I therefore make and ordain this my last will
& Testament first committing my soul to God who
gave it and my body to the grave to be buried
in a decent manner under the direction of my
executors and my worldly estate that it has please
God to bless me with. I give & bequeath in manner
following, to wit: after paying all my Just & lawful
debts 1st I give & bequeath to my son William Whitell
three hundred pounds or to that amount in property
besides the property that I have already given him
which he has had in possession for some time past.
2^d I give and bequeath to William W. Blakely son
to George & Peggy Blakely one hundred pounds or a
young negro to that value. 3^d I give and bequeath
to William D. Whitell son to James Whitell a
negro girl named Clary which said James has had
in possession for some time past. 4th I give
and bequeath to William W. Ewing son to Reuben

For her support for her to dispose of in any man-
ner she may think proper or I leave it in the power
of my executors to allow her to have a young
negro named Sam in stead of the profits pro-
ceeding from the estate left in her hands at
her election at my decease, witness my hand
& seal this 15th day of March 1815

kind, Horses, cattle, sheep & Pigs, except an Horse
of twenty Pound value all my house hold and
Kitchen Furniture of every kind, and all my
Plantation and Farming utensils, of every kind
also my riding carriage to her and her heirs forever
Then I give unto my Brother Thomas Johnston my Negro
man David, his wife Milla Kate and Harris also
