 County of Logan and state of Kentucky being of perfect
 mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed
 for all men once to die; do make and ordain this my
 last will and testament. and as touching such world
 ly estate wherewith it has pleased god to bless me in
 this life I give, devise, and dispose of the same in the
 following manner and form first my will and desire
 is that all my Just debts and funeral expences be paid
 secondly I leave to my brother Jeremiah Warbrough the
 laborer of my negro man Ben during of his life

and at his death, I give and bequeath the the said
 Negro Ben to all my brother Jeremiah Yarbrough's
 Children that may then be alive to them and their
 heirs forever. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my
 nephew Benjamin Yarbrough my shot gun, and
 my saddle and bridle to him and his heirs forever.
 Fourthly and lastly, I give and bequeath to my
 brother Jeremiah Yarbrough: Whom I constitute
 make and ordain the sole executor of this my
 last will and testament all the real and
 residue of my estate both real and personal
 by him freely to be disposed and enjoyed and
 I do hereby disallow revoke and annul
 all and every other former Testaments, wills, Legacies
 bequests and executory by me in any wise before
 named, willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confir-
 ming this and no other, to be my last will and
 testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal, the tenth day of July in
 the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred
 and Eleven. Signed sealed published pronounced
 and declared by the said William Yarbrough
 as his last will and testament in the presence

 & Testament of Wm Yarbrough dec'd was produced in
 Court by Jeremiah Yarbrough the executor therein
 named & proven by the Oaths of Harvey Roberts &
 Levi Roberts two subscribing witnesses thereto and
 ordered to be recorded

In the name of God amen I John Ward of the
 County of Logan State of Kentucky being mindful of the
 frailty of human nature & that it is appointed for all men
 once to die, being of sound mind memory & understanding
 do therefore make this my last will & Testament, in manner
 & form following that is to say First & principally I com-
 mit my soul to Almighty God my body the over there to
 be decently buried according to the direction of my family
 Item my will and desire is that my beloved wife Mary
 Ward shall have my land there being two hundred acres
 also two horses by the names of Jack & Fox, also all my
 stock of cattle (except two Steers - cow & calf) all my
 flock of hogs & three sheep & all my plantations utensils
 also all my household and kitchen furniture, the
 above property to be for the benefit of my wife during
 of her natural life, or widowhood then to be equally
 divided between my sons Jeremiah, John James
 William, Thomas & Lewis, Ward. I also give to my
 son James one mare (blaze) & my gun & one saddle
 the above mare Fox is to be put to horse and have
 a colt for each & every one of my Children except
 James. I give my beloved Daughter Sally one, Cotton
 Bed & Furniture, & one cow and calf my Daughters
 Peggy, Polly, Lucy & Nancy Ward, each of them to
 have one bed and furniture when they marry or
 leave their mother, I wish the property to be carefully kept
 and not wasted or made away with, if my wife can
 make payment for the balance I owe for the land
 she may keep the two horses & two steers, if not they
 must be sold to pay that debt lastly I appoint
 John McDaniel & Jeremiah Ward my whole and sole
 executors of this my last will & Testament. In
 witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 this 25th day of March 1811
