On the fifteenth Day of September In the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and eleven I the undersigned Body full of sound mind and Memory In the name of God Amen I make this my last will and testament that after paying of all my just debts I Item I give & bequeath to my son Elisha Smith the three Negroes that I have and my wish is that My son Bustin Smith should take them and keep them and give him one year schooling or more for which I wish my son Bustin Smith to have out of My Estate six Barrels of corn and two hundred lb of pork and then after Elisha quits his Education I wish Bustin to bind him to some good trade and for him to keep his Negroes until he is twenty one years of age then I give to my wife Pancy Smith my land and plantation whereon I now live and all my other property after paying My children what I owe them I leave them during their Natural life time or older to be divided then to be Equally divided my Land between my two sons Elisha Smith and Bustin Smith and my other property to be divided and Equally divided between all my children except Anna Lois and Isaac Smith to which I give one Dollar each to be paid to them out of my Estate Also I give to my two grand children Jackson Edwards & Alley Edwards one Dollar each to be paid as above and my last wish and desire is that my son Bustin Smith shall be my Executor with my son Judham Smith - I do Witness where I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & date first written above

I Jacob Townsend of Logan County, State of Kentucky being sick and weak in body but of sound mind willing to mind the morality of my body to make this my last will and testament & first to all I recommend my soul to God who gave it & my body to the earth and as touching such worldly Estate which I have pleased God to bless me in the life I give, demise & dispose of the same in the following manner & form -

Item I will to my beloved wife Mary Townsend during her natural life my dwelling house and plantation including the whole of the tract of land whereon I now live household furniture & farming utensils also my two Negro men Jacob & Jack and my three Negro women Silvia, Malda & Tamar four work horses to be kept by her during her natural life for her own support & to raise and educate my children and -

Item I have given to my son William Townsend one horse & saddle one feather bed & furniture and a negro boy named Joe nine years old and one cow and calf I have also given to my daughter Elizabeth Willigen one mare & saddle one feather bed and furniture one cow & calf and one negro girl named Dinah seven years old and I have given to my son Thomas Townsend one horse and saddle also I have given to my son John Bailly Townsend one horse & saddle all of which property they are to account for at a future division of my Estate among all my children or their heirs -

Item I give to my daughter Pancy Townsend my negro girl named Hannah one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf and saddle & a cow & calf all to be delivered to her whenever she may marry or chose to leave the family and to account for them at their value when received -

Item I give to my daughter Anna Townsend my negro girl named Phillis one beast and saddle one feather bed & furniture & cow and calf to be delivered to her whenever she may marry or chose to leave the family -

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and to account for the same at their value when she receives them

Item I give to my Daughter Lucy Townsen my negro girl named Clementine one feather bed and furniture one breast & saddle horse and all to be delivered to her whenever she may marry or choose to leave the family being first of lawful age

and to be accounted for as the property given to the others at a general Division of my Estate

Item, I will that all the rest of my young Negroes & the issue of the Shovel left to my wife remain on the plantation for the purpose of being given to my sons as they become of lawful age & leave the family and at that time I will that one young negro out of my Estate a horse & saddle & bed and furniture be given them each and that to be accounted for at a future division

Item, I give to my beloved wife Mary Townsen in addition to other property here before named my whole Stock of cattle Sheep & hogs to be kept & used by her for assistance in Raising my children & helping them as they may become of age &c

Item, I will that at the death of my wife if my youngest son Jabez Smith Townsen is then twenty one years of age, or should he die at any time after he is of that age then my will is that my dwelling house plantation & the whole of my tract of Land be sold to the highest bidder at twelve months credit and the negroes Jabez (excepted) be divided by lot at valuation all other Stock household & kitchen furniture & Plantation tools and utensils be sold at twelve months credit and then that there be an Equal Division of all my estate to take place between all my children, to wit: Fanny Townsen, Thomas Townsen, John Bailey Townsen, William Townsen, Elizabeth Milligin, Anna Townsen, Stephen Townsen, Lucy Townsen, Greenberry Townsen, Allen Townsen, James M. Townsen, and Jabez Smith Townsen each one accounting for all the property heretofore given by me or that may be due by them hereafter before this division so that in the Last division all of my said children or their heirs may have an equal share of my Estate

Item I will at the death of my wife & my son Jabez Smith Townsen becomes twenty one years of age, if my negro man Jacob should be then living that he be free forever

Item I will that my two Hells be sold at one

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years credit to the highest bidder also the Subs and the money arising therefrom be applied to the payment of Doctrs Charges & whatever small debts I may justly owe — And lastly I do hereby nominate my beloved wife Mary Townsen Executor and my brother Light Townsen Executor of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the twenty eight day of January in the year 1817
