 hold and kitchen furniture plantation utensils of all &c
 Every kind (excepting hogs &c to have & to hold during her
 natural life or widowhood) I Give & bequeath to be Polly
 & Polly Montgomery Heirs of my son Alex. I. Montgomery
 do all my right & title to dear love tract or parcel of
 land supposed to be one hundred and fifty acres north west
 of my present farm adjoining the lands of Richd Bell Sen.
 which lands is settled by Zachariah Bernut, to them & their
 heirs forever also I give upon good account which I now have
 against my dead son Alex. I. Montgomery of those particular items
 (to wit) one horse bridle & saddle one hundred dollars one set of
 Eighty Dollars three cows 10 Dollars each, two two five Dollars one
 or three ditto one horse a Dollar, hogs two Dollars which I did
 acct. I freely tender up as satisfied I give and bequeath to my
 dear daughter Polly Blanchet & Anna Roob one hundred & fifty
 acres of land lying North East of my present farm to be
 equally divided between them and agreeable to the present
 understanding of said division as to take thirty acres each
 of my claim known by the name of my McAdams claim with
 the conditions my daughter Polly Blanchet's claim as respects
 the thirty acres of my McAdams claim to commence so the cor-
 ner of the hundred acres I now live on and to run out to make
 good the quantity before named & also give and bestow on her the
 acct. which I now have open against Willis Blanchet of those
 particular items (to wit) one horse seventy Dollars one cow
 ten Dollars one pot two Dollars one saddle twenty two Dollars
 one Bed & furniture 20 Dollars one pair of chains one
 Dollar one cow two Dollars one sow three Dollars one ox
 one Dollar one lot of barrels one Dollar &c all of which I
 freely bestow as before named on conditions of s. Blanchet shall
 give to each of my two grand children Polly & Betty Montgomery
 a side saddle worth twenty two Dollars when they arrive
 to the age of Eighteen. I also give in the like manner to
 my daughter Anna Roob the acct. which I now
 have against Wm Roob of those particular items (to wit)
 one mare six Dollars one saddle twenty two one
 cow ten Dollars one Bed & furniture twenty four

two sows five Dollars one pot two Dollars one or two Dollars one cow
 one Dollar one wheel four Dollars I give & bequeath to my
 son Hugh Montgomery one hundred acres of land as before es-
 tablished and agreed on between me and him (to wit) the land
 and boundary which between us same Perkins has a bargain
 him of six years I give and bequeath to my daughter
 Polly Morton at the death of my wife and daughter Sarah
 Montgomery three hundred Dollars to be raised from the sale
 of the land whereon I now live I command most convenient
 by my execut. to her I have forever also give up the acct.
 acct. which I have against James Morton of those particular
 items (to wit) one mare and colt twenty Dollars one horse
 twenty two Dollars one Bed and furniture twenty Dollars
 one cow ten Dollars one pot three Dollars one oven two Dol-
 ars one Bell one Dollar set of or ware one dollar one hoe
 one dollar one wheel four Dollars one set of Breast
 Chains two Dollars each but the 1st of March 1814 seventy
 dollars one cow two Dollars all of which I freely bestow
 to them and their heirs forever I Give & bequeath to my
 daughter Sarah Montgomery the tract of land whereon I
 now live during her life provided she should live after her
 mother though not considering this claim to have any interference
 with the claim already given her mother as I presume she
 will never marry my desire is to leave her the mentioned land
 for her support after her mother may leave her then I de-
 sire it may be sold together with the fifty acres of head right
 land I now own the hundred I now live on as well as the
 lands of Bow Proctor & James offutt & then equally divided
 between each of my lawfull representatives after making the
 sum of three hundred Dollars as before named to my Daugh-
 ter Polly Morton I Give and bequeath to my son William
 Montgomery one hundred & seventy three acres of land or
 there about adjoining the land of Richd Bell Sen. Roob
 Travers & others apart of the McAdams claim of the
 other part my own claim of head right To him & his
 heirs forever & further my desire is as it respects all
 Personal Property such as stock household kitchen
 furniture plantation utensils as before named my
 desire is shall be equally divided among each of my
 surviving children as lawfull Legates at the death
 of my wife with this condition my son William to have out
 of said property at the death of his mother or marriage shall
 have given him a horse and saddle worth twenty five Dollars
 one cow & calf worth ten Dollars one Bed & furniture twenty Doll-
 ars one plow hoe or pot each of the common sort (kind)
 also plow axes (two pair &c) and have an equal share of the

residue with my before named children and lastly I ordain & appoint this my last will & testament my true & lawful Execut^r

signed & sealed & delivered in presence of us and each of us present this 15th day of May when in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & sixteen.

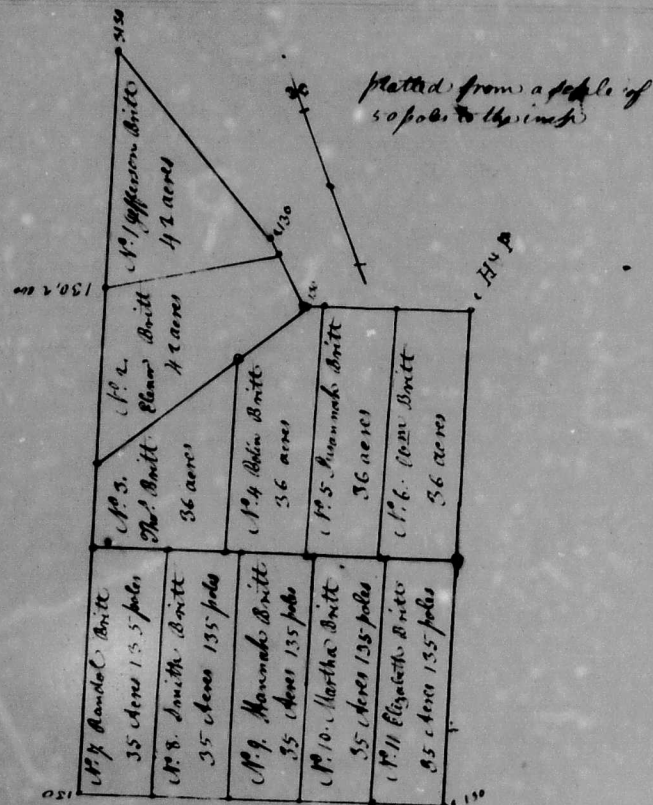

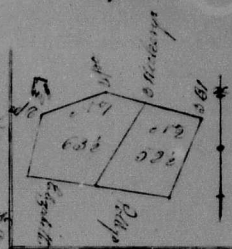
