Be it remembered that of Elizabeth Hammard of Logan County and State of Kentucky, being very sick & weak in body but sound in mind & memory and knowing that all have to die do ordain & leave this as my last will & testament in the first place I wish to recommend my soul to almighty God who gave it me & my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executor & as for what property it has pleased God to bestow me with in this world I wish it disposed of in the following manner First I desire that all my debts be paid & specially I give & bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Polly Hammard my negro man Lewis with this reserve that his labour is to be applyed to the support & schooling of my three Sons Alexander, Isaiah & David until they are bound to some trade agreeable to the will of their father David Hammard deceased after which period to be the property of S<sup>r</sup> Polly Hammard to her & her heirs forever as for my stock of all kinds household & kitchen furniture with my Farming utensils to be sold by the promiscuous thereof divided between my four Sons Thomas, Alexander, Isaiah & David as they severally become of age and I hereby appoint & constitute S<sup>r</sup> Polly Hammard my sole Executor to this my last will & testament In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand & seal this 27<sup>th</sup> day of April 1820
