Knowing that all men must die Ephraim's father dec^d and Thomas Cava my last will and Testament The manner in which I have my property disposed of at my death I therefore give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary my negro woman bond and her choice one of my negro boys and also give unto her the choice one of my negro boys together with a saddle and bridle and also the skin and three of my cattle and also give and bequeath unto my wife the furniture and the furniture thereof and also the whole of the kitchen furniture and also one bed bedding and pillows and pair of gait and one portrait to remain here during her life and at her death said portrait is to be sold and the money that proceeds therefrom shall be equally divided between all of my children. I also give and bequeath unto my wife daughter Jane my negro boy Leg and the balance of my property is to be sold at my death and out of the money that proceeds therefrom give and bequeath unto my son Ephraim and Thomas two dollars each and out of \$5 money give and bequeath to my youngest daughter Ann Elizabeth and husband of the latter each and out of \$5 money give and bequeath to my eldest daughter two hundred & twenty five dollars and wife two daughters (Martha & Susan) give and bequeath twenty five dollars each and the balance of \$5 money shall be equally divided between all of my daughters Jane, Susan, Ann, Margaret, Ann & Elizabeth and also all of my debt is to be collected and equally divided between the above mentioned six daughters and I appoint my wife & Thomas and executor to execute my will given above my hand this twenty fifth day of June and Thomas eight hundred & twenty
