Be it known, that I, Andrew Miller of Logan County and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and memory, thanks be given to God for the same, calling into mind the uncertainty of life do make this my last will and Testament, first recommending my soul to them gave it, my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my friends, my worldly Estate I give, dispose and bequeath to the same in the manner and form as following, I am the first. I will that all my just debts be paid - secondly - I land to my Beloved wife Sarah Miller, during her natural life or widowhood, the plantation whereon I now live, together with the dwelling house and all the other buildings, after giving Sally & T. Harrison now & Young, Two Acre and a half of the upper end of said tract to be divided by a straight line, it is understood that the said Sarah Miller and William M. Harrison may dispose of the balance of the land whereon the plantation is, one third of the purchase money to be given to Sarah Miller and the remainder to William M. Harrison. - Third - I sell my House hold and Kitchen Furniture, Farming utensils, Horses and Stock of every description to my beloved wife during her life, also my negro man, Charles Girl Betty, negro Boy Jim, after her death the said negroes Horses and Stock to be given to William M. Harrison. - Fourth - After my death, I will my woman Saba, Boy Liza to be delivered to my Grand Daughter Sally & T. Young, I will Fifth - To William M. Harrison I bequeath the following named negroes, man Jim, woman Nancy, man Lewis, Girl Fanny, Boy Henry, Boy Pleg, Girl Emily, Girl Mary, To Rachel Miller. I leave one hundred and fifty dollars, to be paid at the death of my wife Sarah Miller - To my Grand Daughter Sally & T. Young, I also give my woman Sepha after Mrs. Miller's death, the first child that the said Mrs. Young may have, I wish to have my Girl Rose & further design Mrs. Young to retain her the servants she has got. (Fourth) negro lad Lemps negro Boy Washington, Girl Pat, Girl Sina - - To my wife S. Miller I leave four cows and calves one Beef and the balance of the Stock, and wagon to be disposed of as wife and Grandson William M. Harrison may find necessary, my House and lot in Russellville I leave to my wife and William

Mr. Harrison, half to each, till the death of Mrs. Miller, afterwards all to Mrs. M. Harrison. - And lastly - I do hereby constitute and appoint as my Executors, my wife Sarah Miller, Elizabeth M. Harrison and William Harrison Executors. I do revoke all other wills hitherto made by me, given under my hand this 30 day of November 1819
