revoking all former wills and testaments by me made. First
and before all things I commend my soul into the hands
Almighty Disposer of all things hoping through his grace to
receive his all powerful Protection - Secondly - in consideration
of the Natural Love and affection I owe to my dear
children after the payment of all and every my just debts
and funeral Expenses I give & bequeth all my (move and
personal property whatsoever and wheresoever) leaving my
Executors hereafter named the power of disposing of
that part of my personal property which they may think
proper for the benefit of all and every of my S. Children
hereafter named and also all Bills Bonds monies and
Securities for money I do owe and demands whatsoever
which I may have against any persons or persons whatsoever
- or and also all sums of money which may hereafter
come unto my S. dear Children that is to say Philip
Slater Hall William Catherine marian Eliza George
Sharlott James Harriet alexander and John Slater Hall
to divide between them share and share alike at the
time when they shall or may respectively arrive at the
age of Twenty one year. But in case any of my said
