I agreeable to an order from the Logan County Division court for the division of the Land Estate of John Middle Dec^d we met on s^d lands on the 26th of Feby 1818 and provided to lay off the third part of s^d Estate to Margaret Middle widow of s^d John Dec^d as follows beginning on a large post oak the westwardly corner of 200 acres Military Survey in the name of Gradick thence CP. 43 & 74 poles to a red oak on the bank of Red River thence North 14° 00 00
