Be it remembered that I Elizabeth Hannah of
Logan County and State of Kentucky, being
very sick & weak in body but sound in mind &
memory and knowing that all have to die I
do ordain & have this as my last will &
testament in the first place I wish to recom-
mend my soul to almighty God who gave
it me & my body to the earth to be decently
buried at the discretion of my Executor & as for
what property it has pleased God to bless me
with in this world I wish it disposed of in
the following manner First I desire that
all my debts be paid secondly I give & bequeath
unto my beloved Daughter Polly Hammond
my negro man Lewis with this negro
that his labour is to be applyed to the support
& schooling of my three sons Alexander Isaiah
& David until they are bound to some trade
agreeable to the will of their father David Hannah
deceased after which period to be the property
of P. Polly Hammond to her & her heirs forever
as for my stock of all kind household & kitchen
furniture with my farming utensils to be
sold & the proceeds thereof divided between
my four sons Thomas Alexander Isaiah &
David as they severally become of age
I do hereby appoint & constitute Eliza Hammond
my sole Executor to this my last will & tes-
tament In witness whereof I hereunto
set my hand & seal this 17th day of
April 1820

Sarah Pope, fifty acres of land whereon I live,
also a negro yearling colt, and two Pullets, swine, and
a negro boy Ben, to her and her heirs forever, also
my Riding mare and Bridle, allow all my
household and kitchen furniture, and all my stock
of every kind except a bolt, and it is my desire that
my Brother Solomon should have it, it is my will
and desire that my beloved Brother have my silver
watch, I constitute and appoint my beloved wife
Sarah Executrix and James Slaughter Executor of
this my last will and testament, in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this the Twenty First of November anno Domini
1819
