On the fifteenth Day of September In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven in the evening Lowly Body But of sound mind and Memory In the name of God I men I make this my last will and testament that after paying of all my just Doble Item I give & bequeath to my dear herten Smith & my three Negroes tit little David & Ellen and my wish is that My son Buston Smith Should take them and herten and give him one year Schooling or more for which I wish my son Buston Smith to have out of My Estate six Barrells of corn and two hundred lb of pork and then after Herten quite his Education I wish Buston to bind him to some good trade and for him to keep his Negroes untill he is twenty one years of age Item I give to my wife Nancy Smith my Land and plantation whereon I now live and all my other property after paying My Children what I am in portion I leave them during ther several Life time or longer too and then to be Equally divided my Land Between my two sons Elisha Smith and ^{Samuel} ~~Frederick~~ Smith and my other property to be sold and Equally divided Between all my Children Except Amy Lois and Isaac Smith to which I give one Dollar Each to be payd to them out of my Estate Also I give to my two grand Children Jackson Edwards & Abby Edwards one Dollar Each to be paid as before and my last wish and Deser is that my son Buston Smith Shall be my Executor with my son Judham Smith In Witness whereof I have hereunto set My hand & seal the day & date first written Above

I, Jabez Bowen, of Logan County, State of Kentucky, being very sick and weak in body but of sound mind, calling to mind the morality of my body to make this my last will and Testament, I first to all commend my soul to God who gave it & my body to the earth and as touching such worldly Estate, wherewith is has pleased God to bless me in this life, to give, demise & dispose of the same in the following manner & form —

I send I will to my beloved wife Mary Torconsen during her natural life my dwelling house and plantation including the whole of the tract of land whereon I now live household furniture & farming utensils Also my two Negro men Jacob & Jack and my three Negro women Silva, Ma-ilda, & Tamar four work horses to be kept by her during her natural life for her own support & to raise and educate my children on

Item I have given to my son William Townsen one horse & Saddle one feather bed & furniture and a negro boy named Joe nine years old and one cow and calf. I have also given to my daughter Elizabeth Milligen one mare & Saddle one feather bed and furniture one cow & calf and one negro girl named Dinah seven years old and I have given to my son Thomas Townsen one horse and Saddle also I have given to my son John Bailly Townsen one horse & Saddle all of which property they are to account for at a future division of my estate among all my children or their heirs.

I give to my Daughter Pancy Townsend my negro-
girl named Hannah one feather bed and furni-
-ture one Beast and Saddle & a cow & calf all to be
delivered to her whenever she may marry or choose to leave
the family and to account for them at their value
when received.

Item I give to my daughter Anna Townsen my negro girl
named Phillis one beast and saddle one feather bed &
furniture & Cow and calf to be delivered to her when
ever she may marry or chose to leave the family
