I hereby give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Cestray one third part of all my lands during her natural life and also give her one negro woman called and known by the name of Chany also one bed and household furniture also one key. I have called by also one red mule cow and her calf all the above named property I do to have in quiet possession during her life & after her decease the said negro woman is to be the property of my son John Cestray she and her increase to him and his heirs forever after the decease of my said wife the bed and furniture is to be the property of my daughter Nancy Cestray to her and her heirs forever and all my pewter after the decease of my said wife is to be equally divided between my son John Cestray and my two

daughter Polly Westray and Fanny Westray and after the
 demise of my said wife my son John Westray to have in
 full and full power and right of the said property to be equally
