It is further my will and desire that my beloved wife Sally Davis should be the Executrix of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby appoint her my only and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament and it is my will and desire that the court should permit her to qualify as Executrix of this my last Will and Testament without giving security in the usual way or in any way whatever.
