

The first and last will of Thomas Wash
 I Thomas Wash of Kent County and State of Kentucky
 Resolved hereinafter to dispose of my worldly
 in the following manner "They will receive all or any
 part of my limited property in this State or
 Virginia and out of the proceeds pay all my just debts
 and with what may be left or any part thereof will
 purchase a tract of land for the estate of my part of
 the United States and divide the same thro' all
 the part of my estate including the part of land they
 may purchase I wish kept together during my wife's
 life except three negro girls hereafter named and
 given to my three daughters and at the death of
 my wife all the above real estate personal to be sold
 and equally divided between all my living children and
 in case any of them shall die before my wife and
 leave heirs the same heirs shall be entitled to their parent
 part and my dear son Thomas Wash's children entitled
 to his part in this division. My son John Wash I have
 given \$600 in money this money to remain until his father's
 and I shall be made come with him to my daughter
 Elizabeth Packer I have one negro girl named I wish serve
 her natural life and at her death the said slave Packer
 with all her increase shall become the heirs of my
 daughter Elizabeth to have and to hold forever
 this said slave Packer is to be under the same
 management of my Executors who will see that her
 time is disposed off for the best advantage of my son
 daughter her said name is Packer having no power
 and the time is said slave only what he receives from
 my Executors he is not to be sold or hired to pay my debt
 Packer has a heretofore money contract to have my son in
 law John Packer having with the family I wish him to
 have two cows & calves which I give and the direction
 of my Executors in all respects as I do my slave Packer
 these cows to be accounted for at the death of my
 wife the proceeds of ^{also} ~~the~~ sale at the death of my wife
 which Packer as my daughter has named may be
 entitled to shall be under the direction of my Executors
 the same as the negro girl Packer I wish also when
 Packer quits my family that my Executors give him
 a moderate allowance for his family for one year
 and some little furniture to my wife without
 making any charge of the same and of the preparation

of the State will admit to purchase a yr or half of section
 of land for my daughter to be reimbursed to the estate at the
 death of my wife this land to be under the same disposition
 as the other property but my daughter and to mine to have
 give all debt Packer myself and Packer is hereby cancelled
 my son Thomas dying man in debt than what little
 property he had was worth I have paid and will pay
 his debt and have taken possession of his property without
 administration which property I give to his wife to be used
 in raising the children except the negro girl and the land
 I gave him which is to be kept by my Executors until the
 children come of age when they shall choose to come receive
 the same and my son John I give a lot of land but give the
 widow 300 acres of land this price I shall give him one acre
 half and his fee at my house and one cow and calf at his father's
 if any more administrators on this my son Thomas Wash and
 property my Executors will demand of him all the money due
 and paid my debt how and when up all the property
 belonging to this estate in order to raise the children of my
 son Thomas his widow is always welcome to her board in the
 family and must be paid her maintenance to the same end I may
 think proper to clothe herself and children privately she gives them
 herself I give the two boys William and Thomas Wash out of
 Thomas Wash and bond his money doctors when they come of
 age but out of this sum my Executors will see that they have a
 moderate schooling in what manner my Executors will be the best
 judge. But in no case is any of this money to be
 the direction of money for this purpose I give my son John
 Wash five hundred dollars to purchase himself a negro
 boy if he thinks proper to make use of the money that way
 I wish him to live in the family as he does at present to purchase
 him a horse out of the estate and furnish his clothing and expenses
 he must be paid something reasonable for that his services
 I give to my daughter only one negro girl Mariah to her and
 her heirs forever and may build and saddle and when the
 maned if ever the does one cow & calf and a pig and moderate
 furniture such as a bed and furniture pots & other knives and
 forks plates dishes &c and a spinning wheel I give to my
 daughter Emily one negro girl Mary to have and to hold forever
 with any other article and on the same terms I have given
 to my wife I give to my son Hugh one negro boy Lewis and
 free at the death of my wife but if my Executors can purchase
 a boy few or no years old this boy may go in lieu of Lewis
 and the 200 I also give him one horse saddle and bridle
 and I wish he may live to the death of my wife that
 some stock furniture I have given to the girls my Executors

see that though he were meeting smiling death my son
 David many years my wife death he is willing to the
 same stick and therefore that my daughter is that way
 & the next of my children die give the death of my wife
 they will be made good my first will in that Thomas
 Washes or section of land in the State of Illinois has
 the latest paid on it until Thomas Washes some times of
 age when they are to have the same new thing I
 appoint my first son and David with my first to his
