W Lewis
Will

I Walter Lewis now of sound mind & right senses
do make this my last Will and Testament hereby
revoking all others heretofore made by me, to wits
I bequeath to my beloved wife Sally Lewis during
her life time in case she should not carry
all my estate both real and personal includ-
ing that also both real and personal which
may fall to my part in the division of my

fathers estate next fallow widder of every kind what-
soever having it to her judgment and discretion of
her paying my just debts to aid and assist each
and all of our children as they may need it and
she may find herself able to spare it.
It is my will and desire that my land in Caroline
county in Virginia commonly known by the name
of Frank White given to me by my wife's father
(should) be sold and the money arising from the
sale to be applied as far as it may go to the
payment of my debts and also that a bond left
in my fathers hands and since his death no doubt
among his papers given to me by Henry & John
Burns for nearly four hundred dollars the
bond given in 1816 but the particular date of it
not recollectd should be applied towards the discharge
of my own bonds given to William Arnold and Thoma-
s Chiles dated also in 1816 but the particular date
of which are not recollectd and that due & of my
negroes as my wife may think ^{most} suitable should
be sold to pay off all the balance of my just debts
of every kind which she may not be able to obtain a
credit on until the money may arise from the
profits of my estate to discharge, in case she should
be able to obtain a credit on any of my debts until
she may raise the money from the profits of my
estate it is my will & desire that she may have the
privilege of doing so, and at the death of my wife
(if she should not marry it is my will and desire
that my whole estate both real & personal of every
kind should be equally divided among all our chil-
dren or their legal Representatives if any of them
should have died leaving him or their bodies taking
into the portion of each whatever they may have
received in my life time and in the life time of my
wife at its value when received But this I do not
wish to apply to negroes but as they and their in-
crease must be brought back into my estate and
be equally divided among all of our children at my
wifes death when a general division of all my
estate may take place among them After my death
in case my wife should marry & then live her dur-
ing her life time one negro man named Moses &
also one negro man named Jacob a feather bed and
furniture and a horse not exceeding \$ 80 in value
also a saddle and bridle and at her marriage it is

my Will and desire that the rest of my estate not lent to my wife should be equally divided among all of our children and their legal representatives as aforesaid and at the death of my wife after such marriage that all the property lent to her during her life time should be equally divided among all her children then living or their legal representatives. It is also my wish and desire that my wife in case she should marry and should think proper to take it should have the use of fifty acres of the land on which I now live during her life time and at her death that it should be equally divided among all of her children then living or their legal representatives as aforesaid. It is further my will and desire that my beloved wife Sally Lewis should be the Executrix of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby appoint her my only and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament and it is my will and desire that the court should permit her to qualify as Executrix of this my last Will and Testament without giving security in the usual way or in any way whatever. Witness my hand this eleventh day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen.
