It is my desire that the Bond which I purchased of
Samuel W. Godkin should be sold to the highest bidder
also one cow and calf my shoe benches, and all my shoe
makers tools. Six setting chairs, half dozen knives &
forks, two pewter plates some painted basin & a shot
gun. Item I give to Peggy Holloway an cow &
calf one spider, one shovel & tongs, one better bed and fur-
-niture four turkeys, my shoes, and fifty dollars in money
for ever. Item I give to Betty Godkins my Christening
gt is my desire that all the balance of my property I
have not given as above should be sold.

It is my will and desire that all my just debt
should be paid. Item 3rd I give to my sister
Polly Ogman all the balance of money arising from
my estate, for ever. I nominate and appoint William
Garman my whole & sole Executor to this my last will
and testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & affixed my seal made this 1st day of June
1815, (interlined before signed) his
