 Mill Townsend of Logan County and State of Kentucky
 being in perfect health of Body, and of perfect
 mind and memory, thanks be given unto
 God, calling into mind the mortality of my
 body and knowing that it is appointed for all
 men to die, do make and obtain this my
 last will and Testament, that is to say prin-
 cipally and first of all, I give and Recommend
 my Soul into hands of almighty God that gave
 it, and my body, I recommend to the earth,
 to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the
 discretion of my Executors (hereafter named),
 and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith
 it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give
 demise and dispose of the same in the follow-
 ing manner and form—

First I give ~~to my~~ and bequeath to my beloved
 Son Thomas Townsend the land and plantation
 whereon I now live, also my negro woman
 named Ball, and three negro girls to wit: La
 Rachel and Fanny, and their increase, also one
 mare, and nine head of cattle also all my
 household furniture with two feather beds
 & furniture, and all the plantation tools &
 moveables, &c.
