

I am I will that my following nephews to wit George Washington Baker son of Robt Baker William Hallum son of my sister Nancy Hallum John Bayley son of Uriah Bayley Harry Dudley son of Amos Dudley George Blanton son of Starling Blanton Alfred Baker son of William Baker & John Modole son of John Modole deceased have one hundred dollars each paid to each of their parents to be appropriated by them to pay my a teacher for learning them whilst at school. Item I will that my nephew Robt Payne son of my sister Polly Blanton have my Black Smith and Gun Smith tools. Item I desire that in the first place out of first money collected by my Executors that all my debt be paid wish & desire that my executors appropriate so much of the money arising from the sale of my Estate as is necessary in procuring a brick wall four feet high to be built round my father and mother and ~~graves~~ nephews grave and my own should ~~be~~ laid by their side. If there should be any surplus after the above & following distribution my desire is that it be equally divided between my Brother Robert Baker and Sally Bailey wife of Uriah Bailey. My wish is that my Executors all my negroes at private sale to persons who in all probability will not take them to Oregon my wish and ~~desire~~ also that my wife Sally if she wishes be permitted to take of my real or personal estate what will amount to the ~~at~~ two thousand dollars directed to be paid to her at a fair valuation. ~~and~~ if she so her wish that she make choice of such articles as she wishes to take before the sale be made by my Executors. My will & desire is that fifty dollars be paid out of the proceeds of the sale of my Estate above mentioned to my worthy friend Ephraim Elb living as a testimonial of my respect for him I have in my possession a note on John Washington for seven hundred dollars which when collected I wish my Executors to appropriate supply it as they may think proper for the use and benefit of the children of Nancy Reading formerly Nancy Hallum begotten by James Hallum. I do hereby constitute and appoint Ephraim Elb living my wife Polly Baker and Uriah Bailey my Executors & Executrix to carry into effect my foregoing will & require that the same may be demonstrated of them by the court within my hand & seal this 8th day of August 1817.

In the name of God Amen I William Duman of Logan County and State of Kentucky being sick and weak of Body but of perfect mind & memory do constitute and ordain this my last will and testament as follows to wit. I do give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Betsey Duman the plantation I now live on with all its profits during Life or widowhood to be by her freely disposed and for the property shee was in possession of when I married her & my will that shee should be at her own disposal to do what shee may think proper with I also do gave her the cupboard chairs which is four in number and also two sows & pigs & one small pot & oven and one bar shear plow & millen hoe with all the implements belonging to the plow that is Gears & clevises shee is also to have her maintenance out of any grain that may be in my possession at the time of my death untill shee has had chance of making it on the plantation and also have meat one year out of my stock on the land in my possession at my death and as for my three youngest children Emily, William & Samuel I gave and bequeath one hundred Dollars to each as a Donation for their Infancy and I further gave and bequeath to my daughter Emily one feather bed and furniture and next I gave and bequeath to my son John sixty acres of Land off the upper end of my tract lying next the Pot including a small improvement made by him and also one feather bed and what furniture may be belonging to it RETURN to the next page

And as respecting the balance of my property to my will and desire that it should be sold at vendue to the highest bidder 12 months credit and the money thence arising to be Equally Divided amongst my Children to wit my son John My Daughter Mary King My Daughter Lidy my son William & my son Samuel to be by them freely disposed and enjoyed — and I also constitute and appoint Martin Duncan My Brother and William Spiller my Lawful Executors of this my will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty seventh day of September 1817.

whereon I now live with all the moveable property at my desire for my dear Beloved wife to have and to hold all the property and the Land Containing of one hundred and fifty acres for her support and maintenance and for her home as long as she may live my will & meaning is that nothing shall be removed or sold of my estate during the life of said wife except what she may just cause of and after her death it is my wish for my Daughter Elizabeth to have the Loom and Crockings to her self and then all the moveable property to be sold and the money Equally Divided Between my two Daughter Elizabeth and her the Anne Aust and the Land it is my desire for one Hundred acres of Land to be divided in 4 parts as equal as to value as can be done for my two Sons Isaac & Samuel and fifty acres to be divided in 3 parts for my Sons Abraham Isaac and Daniel Aust and also Isaac & Daniel Aust is to pay my two Daughter Betsey and Betsy 20 pounds each Law full money of Kentucky my son John Aust executor of this my Last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this the 19th day of August 1817.
